Traveling Mercies

You might start your journey in the southwest United States in a dusty town called Why, Arizona. Heading cross-country would take you through Uncertain, Texas. Bearing northeast, you'd make a rest stop in Dismal, Tennessee. Ultimately, you'd reach your destination – Panic, Pennsylvania.

Kenneth Petersen writes those words in the Sunday, July 17, 2022 devotion of *Upper Room*. He writes, "These are real places across the landscape of America, though not a trip you'd ever choose to take." ¹

Sometimes this is what the journey of life feels like. We might go through those places but we sure wouldn't want to settle there or continuously repeat that journey.

God had traveled with the Israelites as they had left slavery in Egypt and were traveling to the Promise Land in Canaan. There were certainly times when they felt the various emotions of wondering why, being uncertain, feeling dismal and moments of panic.

Deuteronomy 2 is one of the places in Scripture which informs us that at times God would say, "Enough of this." In this chapter, Moses is remembering with the Israelite people some of God's workings in their lives.

{Moses said,} "Then we turned and journeyed into the wilderness of the Way of the Red Sea, as the LORD spoke to me, and we skirted Mount Seir for many days."

"And the LORD spoke to me saying:

Our Daily Bread July, August, September 2022. Kenneth Petersen. Grand Rapids, MI: Our Daily Bread Ministries. Sunday, July 17, 2022. 'You have skirted this mountain long enough; turn northward ...

'You are about to pass through the territory of your brethren, the descendants of Esau, who live in Seir; and they will be afraid of you. Watch yourselves carefully.

'Do not meddle with them, for I will not give you any of their land, no, not so much as one footstep, because I have given Mount Seir to Esau as a possession.

'You shall buy food from them with money, that you may eat; and you shall also buy water from them with money, that you may drink.'

"For the LORD your God has blessed you in all the work of your hand. He knows your trudging through this great wilderness. These forty years the LORD your God has been with you; you have lacked nothing." (Deuteronomy 2:1-7)

In our life's journey, we may begin to "skirt" or "circle around and around." We're facing a mountain that we just can't get cross over. Maybe it happens because of some of the wilderness places and trying times in which we asked "why" or were "uncertain" or felt "dismal" and even experienced "panic."

God may come and say, "You've skirted this mountain long enough." Turn toward God. God has been with us and will help us to pass through our next phase of this journey. God does not give us what belongs to others but will provide ways for us to get what we need.



The Acmar Community Quilt

Throughout the entire time that Alabama Fuel & Iron Company was operating in Acmar (1908 – 1950) the law of the land was "Separate, but Equal", so the company's schools were segregated. *The Pell City News* often carried articles from the "white" and "colored" schools. The following school article ran after the death of Charles DeBardeleben.

The monthly meeting of the Acmar Colored Welfare Society was largely attended last Wednesday night. A memorial program was rendered by the school and some of the citizens of the community honoring the memory of Mr. Charles DeBardeleben, former president of our company. The main emphasis was placed on Mr. DeBardeleben as a friend and as a loyal leader of his employees. The meeting was addressed by Mr. Prince DeBardeleben, president and Mr. F. R. Bell, General Manager. Rev. E.C. Johnson of the Acmar-Margaret Methodist Charge made a short and inspiring patriotic talk.


