Myth:

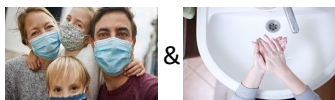
Spring grass burning controls weeds.

 City Code, Title 5-1-1 requires that your dog be licensed. Stop by City Hall for your 2022 dog

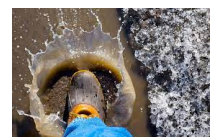
