Safe Haven Receives Grant for Surgical Suite

A \$15,000 grant for Safe Haven of Iowa County will help equip the new surgical suite at the pet rescue nonprofit facility outside of South Amana.

Safe Haven of Iowa County announced Monday that it has received a veterinary medical equipment grant for \$15,000 from Banfield Foundation. The grant will help pay for equipment for the suite so that "Safe Haven will be able to provide in house veterinary care and spay/neuter to its shelter animals. All veterinary care will be provided by volunteer Dr. Barbara Krauss Roland," a release from the group reported.

Remodeling for the surgical suite began this winter as fundraising efforts had yielded results, making the nonprofit's goal of providing on-site, vet medical care and reproductive care for its rescued dogs and cats a reality. A graduate of the Iowa State School of Veterinary Science, Dr. Roland grew up in Amana. She resides and works as a small animal vet in Grinnell, Iowa. She commutes to South Amana one day a week to work as an unpaid volunteer at the clinic.

From the introduction of the Duck Stamp to the creation of the National Wildlife Federation, Darling's influence was felt not only through his cartoons but his passionate and witty advocacy. Considered by many to be one of the most important members of the modern conservation movement in the first half of the 20th century, the impact of his work is still felt today. Tom Milligan has spent 45 years as a working theater artist in Iowa. Milligan will portray Jay N. "Ding" Darling as he visits with the audience at the English Valleys History Center in a show he created himself that has been widely acclaimed. Beginning with his early years in Sioux City where, as a young boy, Ding Darling became aware of the natural world around him while developing skills as an editorial cartoonist, he recalls his remarkable life journey. His story continues to include two Pulitzer Prize-winning editorial cartoons for the Register and a remarkable career as a nationally known conservationist.

The Great South Amana Swap Meet is Coming

Here's something new for the Colonies. The Great South Amana Swap Meet, an outdoor market, will begin operation May 4 and run through October 6, 2018.

The market, free to the public, will be open every Friday from 4 pm to 8 pm, and every Saturday morning from 8 am until 1 pm. Sponsored by Tom Johnson, owner of Johnson's Lower South Antiques, and Bill Tomson, owner of the South Amana Mercantile, it will be located on the Mercantile property in South Amana next to the post office.

As Johnson explained, the swap meet will feature professional vendors of antiques, collectibles, produce, repurposed furniture, and other handcrafted items. Anyone else from Iowa County wishing to buy, sell, or trade garden goods, garage sale items and other used items are also invited to set up free of charge at the markets. Vendors must call ahead and reserve a space. Vendors from outside of Iowa County will be charged a nominal setup fee according to the sponsors.

"We expect a wide range of items that will be available for sale or trade. About the only thing that will not be allowed for sale will be fire arms, ammunition, or fireworks," said Johnson. "The process can be as simple as folks driving up and opening up their car trunks and dropping the tailgates of their pickup trucks and selling to anyone interested. Of course, we anticipate a number of professional dealers displaying their wares. We are certain that there will be a treasure out there for everyone."

In addition the hosts plan to offer for sale "picnic style" food, Iowa wine, beer, soft drinks, and sweets on Fridays. Breakfast items will be served early Saturday, with picnic foods, beer and wine available after 10 a.m.

There will be a stage set up with a sound system for various events throughout the season, including live music, open microphone programs, senior citizen storytelling nights, talent competitions, and bluegrass jams. These events will be sponsored by the Iowa Theatre Artists Company, a not-for-profit performing group, operating in the Amana Colonies. We think this venture will demonstrate so many of the wonderful entertainment opportunities available in the area" said Meg Merckens, ITAC producer. "It's going to be great fun. We can hardly wait for May to get here."

OBITUARY

Former Upper South Amana resident Norman J. Zierold passed away March 7, 2018 at Fairfield, Iowa following a brief illness. Born in 1927 the son of Elmer and Lina Bendorf Zierold, he was raised in Upper South Amana. He graduated from Amana High School in 1945. He enlisted in the navy during the final days of World War II.

Following the war, he attended, and graduated cum laude from Harvard University. He later earned a master's degree in English Literature at the University of Iowa. He spent two years in France on a French Government Teaching Assistantship and a decade in New York City, where he taught at Brearley School, worked at Collier's Encyclopedia, then Theater Arts Magazine and Show. During his career, Norman knew, worked with or met individuals including Dylan Thomas, Charlie Chaplin, Andy Warhol and Barbara Walters.

Norman wrote eight books: true crime novels, tales of Hollywood's golden age, and science fiction: The Child Stars, (1966); Little Charlie Ross, (1967); Three Sisters in Black, (1968), won a Special Edgar Allen Poe Award; The Moguls; Garbo; (both 1969); The Skyscraper Doom, (1972); Sex Goddesses of the Silent Screen, (1973); and his final book, That Reminds Me, A Conversational Memoir (2013).

In 1972, Norman began the practice of Transcendental Meditation. He became a teacher and taught the technique to hundreds in Cedar Falls. Since 2002, he had lived in Fairfield and worked in the communications office at Maharishi University of Management.

In an interview published in 2013, he commented, "I had 200 percent of life."

He was preceded in death by his parents, his brother, Willard Zierold, and his sister Esther (in infancy).

Norman is survived by his sister Loretta Wolf, nephews Geoffrey and Mark, and niece Candice.

A memorial Service and Cremation Ceremony were held at Behner Funeral Home in Fairfield on Friday, March 9.

**1918: PACIFISTIC PATRIOTS OF THE AMANA
SOCIETY DURING WORLD WAR I

The Amana Heritage Society and Amana Arts Guild are co-sponsors of an open house taking place at each venue to commemorate and celebrate the complicated history of the Amana Colonies during World War I.

This art and history exhibit represents a collaborative effort with area artists creating original artworks using actual WWI photos of the Amana Boys. It explores the war years, the men whose First Amendment Rights were violated, and their enlistment and service to our country, doing so with honor during those difficult days.

Founded from the ashes of the Thirty Years War, the Community of True Inspiration maintained pacifistic views throughout its European history from 1714 to its early days on the Iowa prairie during the American Civil War. Yet at the onset of America's entry into World War I, the peace-loving colonists were thrust into battle on multiple fronts for their religious beliefs. Denied exemption from military service as pacifists, nearly 50 Amana Boys shipped out in the summer of 1918. On the home front, despite their loyalty to America, the Colony suffered anti-German sentiment from its neighbors through ongoing negative press, an angry mob, threats of violence, and the need to continually prove their loyalty.

Spend an evening with us celebrating and exploring Amana's heritage. The Amana Heritage Museum and the Amana Arts Guild in High Amana will share this wonderful collection of art between their sites all season. A series of World War I events will continue all year.

PROGRAM VENDOR TRAINING**

For the 2018 season, there will only be webinar training options, replacing all previous video training methods. Individuals are able to attend any of the webinars from their home, library, or family computer.
