**First Reading:** Isaiah 62:1-5

*As the bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so will your God rejoice in you.*

About Zion I will not be silent, about Jerusalem I will not grow weary, until her integrity shines out like the dawn and her salvation flames like a torch. The nations then will see your integrity, all the kings your glory, and you will be called by a new name, one which the mouth of the Lord will confer. You are to be a crown of splendour in the hand of the Lord, a princely diadem in the hand of your God; no longer are you to be named 'Forsaken', nor your land 'Abandoned', but you shall be called 'My Delight' and your land 'The Wedded'; for the Lord takes delight in you and your land will have its wedding. Like a young man marrying a virgin, so will the one who built you wed you, and as the bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so will your God rejoice in you.

**R/** Proclaim his marvellous deeds to all the nations.

**Second Reading:** 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

*One and the same Spirit distributes different gifts as he chooses.*

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses.

**Alleluia, alleluia!** God has called us with the gospel to share in the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Alleluia!**

**Gospel:** John 2:1-11

*The first of the signs given by Jesus was at Cana in Galilee.*

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine'. Jesus said, 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water', and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said; 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now'. This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.

**What does the Cana miracle tell us? Is it that God's special gifts are not meant primarily for our personal benefit but for the service of others? What gifts has God given me?**



#### Come to the Feast

The image of a great banquet to which all are invited appears often in the pages of the Bible as a sign of Divine Hospitality. God's inclusiveness and all-embracing mercy was offered to all, particularly in times when God's people were enduring times of suffering, oppression and exile.

So to, the symbol of a wedding was used in the ancient scriptures, as a human illustration of the partnership that exists between creation, humanity and God – united as one family in a relationship of enduring, creative love. The prophets came to portray God as One who bore such strong feelings and care that he would be ready to suffer for and with the partner, in whatever trouble or danger they found themselves.

The wedding feast at Cana from the Gospel of John needs to be considered in this light. It is more than a miracle about water and wine performed by Jesus as a wonderworker. Jesus, a wedding guest, willingly shares in the celebration and hospitality offered to all guests equally. The wedding celebration provides



a context in which to perceive a greater reality. The bride and groom whose wedding is being celebrated are also in the background. It is the mother of Jesus who sees the opportunity for Jesus to reveal the action of God within this very human context.

We are drawn to reflect on the mutual relationship that God has established with Israel, humans, nations and creation; made visible in the life, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus – who is Emmanuel, God with us.

As a wedding could be seen as a step in the building up of a community of love and sharing of life, Paul in the second reading develops his sense

that each and every person of faith is a person to whom the Holy Spirit has communicated a unique gift, to contribute to the building up of the Christian Community and to be proclaimers of God's love and hospitality to the world.

Let us take time this week to consider the words of scripture: "It is the same Lord working in all of us". Do we take time to recognise our own gifts and acknowledge the gifts of each other? As we enter 2019 may we who participate in the hospitality of God celebrate and encourage each other, that we too may be signs of God's mercy and hospitality to all.
