I Believe in Prayer

I believe in prayer. It is one of the greatest blessings and privileges of being a Christian. It is a shame that it is so often thought of as merely asking and receiving. Prayer is that, but it is much more. To pray is as much a part of the Christian life as breathing is to the natural life. More has been accomplished by prayer than has ever been accomplished by mere natural means. Take just a moment to study some of the great passages of the Bible that teach us the power and importance of prayer. For instance, in Matthew 6:3-15 Jesus teaches that our praying should not be as the hypocrites. He warned against "vain repetitions" and taught us how to pray (vs. 6ff.). Take notice of Matthew 7:7-11. The thrust of the passage is that God does indeed answer prayer. Study the prayer of the Lord in John 17. James teaches that we should consider carefully the importance of praying in the right way to God (Jas. 4:2-3). By now you can easily see that there is a vast difference in saying a prayer and praying one. The privilege of prayer is for all who love and obey God. The request of the disciples of the Lord should surely be our own, "Lord, teach us to pray" (Lk. 11:1).

We need to learn THE PATTERN OF PRAYER. It should come as no surprise to us that our Lord gave important guidelines concerning prayer. Man has not been left without divine direction in this or in any other instance pertaining to life and godliness for that matter. "After this manner pray ye" (Mt. 6:9). The instruction Jesus gave the disciples gave them the

structure and positive meaning of prayer. This prayer is found in Matthew 6, which is a part of the Lord's sermon on the mount. Jesus said, "After this manner, therefore, pray ye." This prayer should be a pattern for praying. Notice how reverent the prayer is. It refers to God in a most respectful and reverent way, "Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name" (Mt. 6:9). As you read this marvelous passage, you soon see how short the petition is, and that it is spontaneous, God-oriented, to the point and full of humility. It expresses our dependence on God: "Give us this day our daily bread" (vs. 11). It expresses our need for forgiveness as well as our need to forgive others (vs. 12).

We need to learn of THE POWER OF PRAYER. The Father has all power, and He knows our needs. The Bible teaches that we, His children, must "ask, seek, knock" when we pray. Just as a natural father will give good gifts to his own children, so God our heavenly

Father gives to His own who ask Him. "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you" (Mt. 7:7). "If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?" (Mt. 7:11). Yet there are other passages which teach that not only is there power in prayer but for our prayers to be acceptable we must "ask in faith, nothing wavering" (Jas. 1:6). There must be faith in our prayers, or they will not be effective. "And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive" (Mt. 21:22). It is the prayer of faith that will avail much (Jas. 5:15). Yes, prayer is powerful, and the only thing which lies beyond its limits is the will of God. (continued next week)
