Explore the Amazing History of You!

Discover your family history with HeritageQuest, an easy-to-search collection of genealogical and historical sources - with coverage dating back to the 1700s.



This online collection includes census records, local history books from around the country, Revolutionary War records and the Freedman's Bank Records, which offer important clues to tracing African American ancestors prior to and immediately after the Civil War.

Just visit <http://tnel.tnsos.org>, and click on "Genealogy" to get started! Or stop by the library to begin your online search.

Tips for getting started on your own amazing family history:

- 1. List what you already know**—start an ancestral chart
- 2. Interview relatives**—make family group sheets
- 3. Get death records**— search death certificates, obituaries, etc.
- 4. Follow death-record clues**— using the time and place of death can lead to birth, marriage, and other records
- 5. Search census records**—learn where ancestors lived
- 6. Search local sources**— research newspapers, local histories, property maps, court and church records, tax lists, wills, etc.
- 7. Don't forget**—family histories, immigration records, ship passenger lists, military records, etc.

The State Library and Archives is commencing the relationship by sharing Tennessee death records from 1908 through 1959 with Ancestry.com and its users. This database included 1.2 million digital images and indexes 3.4 million names that appear in those records.

The records are available free to Tennesseans by visiting the Tennessee Electronic Library (TEL) main web page at <http://tnel.tnsos.org>, then clicking on the "genealogy" tab and then the "Tennessee Death Records" tab.

The Tennessee death records from those years, along with other vital records collected from other states, are also available to Ancestry.com subscribers at www.ancestry.com/vitals.
