The Washington State Jr Outdoor Smallbore Championships took place May 11-13 in Wenatchee, WA. There was an Air Rifle Match, 3P Smallbore Match and Prone Match. Several teams participated. This is the one match where our Junior competitors from both sides of the state meet up and compete. The weather was very warm...mid to upper 80's.

Alec Patajo retained several WA State Perpetual Trophies. The Launi Meili Award goes to the combined aggregate total precision Smallbore score of the Washington State Indoor 3P Championships. He has won the Washington State 3P Outdoor Championships and the Washington State Prone Championships 5 consecutive years. He is the only junior competitor to win it at 4 years in a row. This award started in 1983 in honor of Olympic Gold Medalist and current Air Force Academy Rifle Coach Launi Meili (who is from Washington). He also earned the Washington State Outdoor 3P/Outdoor Prone Championships Perpetual Award as well as the Outdoor Prone Perpetual Award. Congratulations Alec!

Emme Nelson received several awards presented at the banquet Saturday evening which she earned in 2018 in both Smallbore and Air Rifle. She is still recovering from her knee injury.

Congratulations to Gavin Brown taking 1st in his class at the State Indoor Smallbore Championships. His award was presented in Wenatchee.

200 YD 22RF FUN MATCH

We just held another unscheduled, informal play/fun matches for this summer. They are conducted on some Tuesdays and start at 9 am. The range is NOT closed to other members. It usually takes roughly an hour to do the whole thing.

These are simple matches consisting of a sighter string and two 10 round strings at 200 yards shot on the MR 52 target. Each string has a time limit of 15 minutes. Longer on the sighter target if you are having difficulty "finding paper". Any PBC member or their guests are eligible. The cost is \$1, One US dollar, for the match, with the winner taking the pot. If we have more than 7 entries, the 2nd place entry gets their buck back.

There is an additional match called the One-Shot, which, surprisingly enough, takes one shot to complete. This baby's shot on the red 200 yard ASSRA center. If you enter, it'll cost you another buck, with the same winning arrangement as the "big" one. The shot closest to center or highest score, wins.

Any .22 LR scoped rifle qualifies, no separate classes. For the really ambitious, scoped pistols are allowed as well. No .17 or 22 mags, please.
