May 5, 2019 Third Sunday of Easter Jn 21:1-19


Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Breakfast at Tiberia's! We have heard the song! (oh, is it Tiffany's?) Today we hear the story of Jesus appearing to the apostles for a breakfast meeting on the seashore. They do not realize at first that it is Him! But like a Good Savior, Jesus is there, calling His apostles back and taking care of them! So, the Rising just keeps on coming! Jesus continues his 'Resurrection Tour'! A good little study to conduct someday would be to catalog each resurrection appearance (to different people at different places on different occasions) and then answer what is unique about each one. What specific message is Jesus delivering with each resurrection encounter? Of course, what rises to the top in them all is the simple fact of Jesus being alive and active again! Yet, also, in God's plan, Jesus appears risen from the dead to specific people or groups at different times for particular purposes. For sure, He could have just grandly appeared one time in the skyline, like a Showman for everyone to see. That might have settled more doubters with such a great spectacle, but Jesus never performed such glitzy displays for attention in public before His dying and rising either! He didn't want to appear as a circus 'side show' (though he does have a 'show of his side, & hands/feet' with Thomas!) Herod had tempted Jesus to perform a magic show to save Himself at the trial (Luke 23:8). But Jesus always downplayed 'spectacles and marvels'. As a novelty they are impressive, but they don't tend to build deep faith. They are no match for the 'staying power' that personal relationships or close encounters with others build for us. And Jesus wants lasting commitment from disciples that only deep relationship to Him brings.

There are good reasons for Jesus to downplay miracles. First, the human heart is stubborn and prone to miss the point. People rationalize away and deny all kinds of crucial things, so easily being misdirected to the next 'shiny' object. We tend to forget 'showy' works that are just dropped into our lives. I think in my own experience 'convenience leads to complacency'. Or as the proverb says, 'Too easily won is too easily lost'! Psalm 106:13 says "they soon forgot all God had done; they had no patience for his plan" and verse 21 repeats, "They forgot the God who had saved them, who had done great deeds in Egypt". So even great spectacles are too soon forgotten! Jesus Himself mentions a motive for why miracles are not the best faith builders, when he suggests that the hardhearted person with a closed-off mind doesn't actually believe the miracle in the first place. They are too bound in their own self-created worlds or cozy comforts, looking only to what 'they get out of it'. Jesus is pointing to such selfcentered denials of God's work, when he tells a parable where Abraham tells the rich man, in Luke 16:31, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.' Even the dead rising cannot break through a self-imposed personal 'opinion-structure' meant to let in only what builds up one's own self-interests. Jesus challenges the crowd who selfishly followed him after the miraculous multiplication of food, for this very reason. To those who only sought to fill up their own stores, He said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes ... " (John 6:26-27).

Finally, a more subtle reason that Jesus downplays the miraculous is that such exhibits like flashy and false shows of authority, can even be used intentionally to mislead. Jesus warns His disciples to remain vigilant against charlatans and 'phony' prophets in Matthew 24:24 "False messiahs and false prophets will arise, and they will perform signs and wonders so great as to deceive even the chosen, if that were possible." So for Jesus to have a one-time press conference for the whole world to see Him risen, complete with 'show and tell' miracles, was never intended within God's Plan of our salvation. Jesus' didn't need a show, to establish credentials for Himself. He was establishing the Kingdom for us! As if exposing the emptiness of modern marketing, Jesus was not rolling out a new model Apple product after the resurrection. He is leading us back to the Tree of Life again, re-opening the whole garden! Way, more than a roll-out of a new phone, Jesus reveals Himself to be the connecting Network! Once when Jesus was responding to someone marveling about his ability to exorcise demons, He said to them, "if it is by the finger of God that I drive out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you" (Luke 11:20). When Jesus minimizes miracles, we may be surprised. But He was always about serving the Father's will, not his own; revealing the glory of the Father, not His own glory. The Kingdom of God is a kingdom of servants. John 18:36, has Jesus telling us 'My kingdom is not of this world', because the 'greatest among you must be the servant' (Matthew 23:11). Servants in Jesus' kingdom don't have a show, they are 'behind the curtains'.
