## Be Prepared, Not Scared During Preparedness Month

According to the National Household Survey, while more than 75 percent of Americans surveyed reported having supplies set aside in their homes just for disasters, less than 50 percent have a household emergency plan. National Preparedness Month is the time to accomplish preparedness steps for you and your family.

Putting together an emergency plan starts with knowing what types of disasters may affect your region. By visiting <u>www.ready.gov/make-aplan</u>, you can begin to examine four questions that will be the foundation of your emergency plan:

- How will I receive emergency alerts and warnings?
- What is my shelter plan?
- What is my evacuation route?
- What I my family/household communication plan?

September was chosen as National Preparedness Month due to the tragedies of September 11, 2001, events that also helped to create the Public Health Emergency Preparedness program. The theme of this year's National Preparedness Month is "Prepared, Not Scared". 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## Farm Safety & Health Week Set for September



Producing nearly \$11 trillion worth of crops in 2018, North Dakota's agriculture is big business.

But there are countless ways to be injured on the 30,000 farms in the state. According to the U.S. Department of Labor report, agriculture was ranked as the country's most hazardous industry in 2017-2018.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics tracked three deaths of farmers. ranchers or other



agricultural managers in 2017, down from eight the year before. According to the University of Nebraska Medical Center there were 55 agriculturerelated fatalities in North Dakota from 2012 to

2018, to go with 36 injuries. However, it is safe to assume that many more injuries have gone unreported.

Each year the third week in September is recognized as National

Farm & Safety Week and is used as a time to highlight a variety of issues facing farm families. The five themes that make up this year's overall theme. "Shift Farm Safety into High Gear" center prioritizing safety on the farm and rural roadways throughout America:

- Monday Tractor Safety/Rural Roadway
- Tuesday Farmer Health & Opioid/ Suicide Prevention
- Wednesday Safety & Health for Youth in Aariculture
- Thursday Confined Spaces in Agriculture
- Friday Safety & Health for Women in Agriculture
