consecutive A's every reporting period since the ratings first came out in 2012. They are 2 of only 41 hospitals nation-wide that have achieved this straight A record.

TAAG TONIGHT

The Templeton Area Advisory Group (TAAG) - Templeton's version of an advisory planning commission - will meet at 7 pm tonight in the Templeton CSD boardroom (5th & Crocker next to the Fire Station).

TAAG will hear a number of updates from area agencies, and consider two referral projects (proposed cell site at Rancho Road and a request to subdivide an existing parcel off Rossi Road). There are also two items regarding cannabis and an item titled "Possible extension of TAAG boundaries".

According to TAAG Chair Chris Cobey, "There were complaints at the March election that persons with Templeton mailing addresses [were outside the TAAG/TUSD boundaries] and were ineligible to vote."

"In addition, there have been projects proposed in the past which were adjacent to or just outside TAAG's boundaries which aren't covered by any other CAC (County Advisory Council) and thus are not required to be submitted for either municipal or CAC review."

"[Because] people have expressed concern about this lack of review from time to time, we would like to see [what] the level of Board and public interest [may be]," concluded Cobey.



OCEAN HEALTH ADVISORY

The San Luis Obispo County Public Health Department is once again advising the public to avoid ocean water contact for at least three days following last night's rain event.

Rainstorm runoff is known to transport high levels of disease-causing organisms from the watershed and urban areas to the ocean. Surfers, swimmers and others are advised to avoid contact with ocean water during this period, especially in areas close to creeks, rivers, storm drains and other runoff outlets that empty into the ocean.
