

Homemade Fish Sticks

This recipe is one of the best ones that I have found. This is not only good for adults but for kids too.

4 Cod Loins 2 Eggs

1/4 cup of water 1/2 cup flour

1 cup Italian Bread Crumbs

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Cut cod loins into 5 pieces long ways. Mix eggs and water for wash. Dredge each piece of fish in flour. Coat with egg mixture then roll in bread crumbs until well covered. Place on sprayed parchment paper on a cookie sheet. Repeat until all pieces are done. There should be about twenty. Bake in oven for 15-20 minutes or until nice and brown. Each serving is about 5 pieces.

"I didn't have to go out of the church, Mummy. They have a box next to the front door that says, "For the Sick"."


