SEIZE THE DAY!

Set in New York City at the turn of the century, *Newsies* is the rousing tale of Jack Kelly, a charismatic newsboy and leader of a ragged band of teenaged "newsies," who dreams only of a better life far from the hardship of the streets. But when publishing titans Joseph Pulitzer and William Randolph Hearst raise distribution prices at the newsboys' expense, Jack finds a cause to fight for and rallies newsies from across the city to strike for what's right.

Newsies is inspired by the real-life "Newsboy Strike of 1899," when newsboy Kid Blink led a band of orphan and runaway newsies on a two-week-long action against Pulitzer, Hearst and other powerful newspaper publishers. Timely and fresh, the fictionalized adaptation of *Newsies* addresses age-old themes of social injustice, exploitative labor practices and David-versus-Goliath struggles as the young learn to harness their power against a corrupt establishment. High-energy with non-stop thrills, the stage version introduces eight brand-new songs by the original team of Menken and Feldman while keeping many of the beloved songs from the film, including "Carrying the Banner," "Seize the Day," "King of New York" and "Santa Fe."

SUMMER ARTS INTENSIVE is open to high school and college-aged performers, technicians and orchestra musicians and is an experience not exclusive to artists of the West Fargo School District.

TECHNICAL CREW: A crew of 6-8 individuals will be needed in the areas of Sound, Lights, Stage

Management, Costumes, Hair/Makeup, in addition to a scenery build crews

ORCHESTRA: Orchestration includes: BASS, DRUMS, PERCUSSION, GUITAR, VIOLIN, CELLO,

KEYBOARD (I & II), TRUMPET, TROMBONE, REEDS

CAST AUDITIONS/CALLBACKS

There is no sign up necessary for dance auditions but sign-up in 20-minute group slots is asked for vocal auditions. To schedule an audition, please use the sign-up form posted at www.westfargotheatre.com.

For the audition, prepare a musical theatre song cutting approximately 60-90 seconds in length—an accompanist will be provided. Please make considerations for style and time period of the audition selection as appropriate to the show. Likewise, pieces that show ranges of acting and vocal ability are encouraged and preferred.

Please arrive 15 minutes prior to your audition time to allow time to fill in the audition form and conflict calendar. If you have a headshot/small photograph of yourself and/or a resume, please bring this along.

TECH CREW & ORCHESTRA

TECH CREWS: Interested crew members will have the opportunity to work one-on-one with experienced technical mentors/designers. Scenic and Costume builds and design implementation will occur primarily during daytime hours on a schedule similar to cast rehearsal schedules. Flexibility will be necessary for some areas (particularly lighting) which may utilize evening or weekend hours for specific needs.

ORCHESTRA: Enthusiastic musicians who are eager to keep improving their playing skills over the summer months are invited to be a part of this dynamic pit orchestra lead by a team of veteran teachers/mentors.

Please prepare a 30 second piece to perform. There will also be some sight-reading. Experienced musicians are encouraged to audition on more than one instrument. Percussionists are strongly encouraged to show their ability on a variety of instruments.

REHEARSALS & PERFORMANCES

CAST: June choreography workshops will be held during the month of June on select evenings. Vocal sing throughs for featured characters may also be held in June as need and schedule warrants.

Regular rehearsals will be held Thursday, July 5th (1:00-4:00pm) and Friday, July 6th (9:00am-3:00pm). Beginning Monday, July 9th, a structured Monday-Thursday from 9am-4:30pm schedule will be used for the duration of the rehearsal process. Technical rehearsals (beginning July 23rd) will require evening availability. Additionally, cast members are encouraged to assist with marketing events and set construction as needed. Rehearsals will be held at West Fargo Sheyenne High School.

ORCHESTRA: Rehearsals will begin Monday, July 9th and will typically follow a Monday-Thursday from 6-8:30pm rehearsal schedule during the duration of the regular rehearsal process. Technical rehearsals (beginning July 23rd) will require additional evening availability. Regular rehearsals will be held at West Fargo's Cheney Middle School.

NEWSIES will be performed July 27, 28, 30, 31 at 7:30pm and July 29 at 2:30pm for a total of five performances. Strike will follow the last performance and/or on Wednesday, August 1 as needed.

PARTICIPATION FEES

Both high school and college cast members will be assessed a fee of \$275 for their participation in Summer Arts Intensive.

Crew and Orchestra members will be asked to pay a \$50 fee for their involvement.

Flexible payment plans and tuition scholarships may be available upon request and on a per need basis.

CHARACTER DESCRIPTIONS

Male Characters:

JACK KELLY: Handsome, passionate and charismatic leader of the Newsies. A street-smart kid with a dark artistic soul right beneath the bluster. Not a blowhard. This kid's the real thing.

DAVEY JACOBS: A thinker. Raised in a home as opposed to the other Newsies, Davie is the book-smart counterpoint to the other boys. The voice of reason.

LES JACOBS: The fearless kid brother of Davey. Excited by everything the world has to offer and eager to join in the adventure. Fun is this kid's middle name.

JOSEPH PULITZER: Publisher of *The World.* A no-nonsense newsman.

CRUTCHIE: A slight, sickly boy with a huge heart. He walks with the aid of a crutch due to a bad leg, but that doesn't hold him back from being right in the middle of any mischief. A real charmer.

WIESEL: Runs the distribution window of *The World*. Also plays MR. JACOBI, a deli owner, and MAYOR, the mayor of New York City.

SEITZ: Pulitzer's editor. Also plays SNYDER, warden of The Refuge, BUNSEN, Pulitzer's book keeper, and STAGE MANAGER, the stage manager at Medda's theatre.

NUNZIO: A barber. Also plays THEODORE ROOSEVELT, the Governor of New York, a GUARD and POLICEMAN.

Female Characters:

KATHERINE PLUMBER: The strong-willed daughter of Pulitzer. This young lady drips smarts, opinions and confidence.

MEDDA LARKIN: A vaudeville star of the Bowery variety. Risque, tough, with a big voice and GREAT comic delivery. Also plays NUN.

BOWERY BEAUTY: Showgirl at Medda's theatre. Also plays NUN, FEMALE CUSTOMER, and NEWSIE.

HANNAH: Pulitzer's secretary. Also plays BOWERY BEAUTY, NUN, and NEWSIE.

Newsies Ensemble:

SPOT CONLON: Leader of the Brooklyn newsies.

RACE: A newsie with a penchant for betting.

SPECS: A newsie. Also plays BILL, the son of William Randolf Hearst.

AL, BUTTONS, HENRY, FINCH, ELMER, IKE, JOJO, MIKE, ROMEO, MUSH, SPLASHER, TOMMY: Newsies.

BROOKLYN NEWSIES: Newsies from Brooklyn.

DARCY: Upper class son of a publisher. Also plays NEWSIE.

MORRIS DELANCEY: A heavy at *The World*'s distribution window. Also plays NEWSIE.

OSCAR DELANCEY: Morris's equally tough brother. Also plays NEWSIE.
