Army Corps of Engineers to Hold April 2 Public Meeting in Marengo

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will be holding a public meeting and open house, Tuesday, April 2 from 5 – 7 p.m. with a presentation by the Corps at 5:30 p.m. at the Marengo Public Library in Marengo, 235 East Hilton St. regarding the Coralville Lake Water Control Plan update.

The Corps has also decided to extend the public comment period for the Coralville Lake Water Control Plan update from March 15 until April 19. The added meeting and extended deadline came after several Iowa County residents asked if a meeting could be held in Iowa County and expressed concern that more public input and comment was needed before the Corps begins to draft a new plan. Water Control plans define normal operations at the Coralville Lake and Dam. They ensure that the operations of the reservoir conform to laws and applicable federal regulations.

At a public meeting held February 27 at the Iowa City Public Library, the members of the Corps staff shared the timeline for drafting a new plan for regulating the Coralville Lake and dam. Right now they are gathering input from the public. Their goal, as explained at the Feb. 27 meeting, is to collect comments from the public, then begin drafting a new control plan for presentation later this year and acceptance possibly by the spring of 2020. The current Coralville Lake Water Control Plan has been in place since 1992-93 and was amended in 2001. In 1993 the conservation pool level was raised to 683 feet. The control plan stipulates when and how much water is released and the timing of those releases for normal and flood operations.

Amana Meat Shop Delivers on All Fronts

This spring the Amana Meat Shop will begin using its new shipping area, a 2,448 square foot addition to the historic Amana Meat Shop that includes an accessible loading dock, 456 square feet of freezer space and room to prepare, pack and ship the tens of thousands of orders they handle each year.

Designed by Green Drafting and Design of Hiawatha and constructed by Mike Sandersfeld Construction, Amana, the addition will look as if it's been there since the Meat Shop and Smokehouse was established in 1855.

"We wanted it to fit. Really fit, this place, this spot, this street. Justin Green and Mike Sandersfeld saw that and understood immediately that we wanted this new addition to look as if it's been here since day one," said Jeff Popenhagen, Amana Society director of retail sales and marketing.

"We choose the cedar siding and the 9 over 6 windows. The placement of the windows, the roof pitch, the dormers match the original meat shop. When the landscaping is done this spring and the cedar siding is on and weathered a bit it won't stand out as a new addition," Popenhagen said.

Construction started last autumn but was delayed by harsh weather. The siding, landscaping and other finishing touches will be completed this spring

As Popenhagen explained, the new addition gives them the space they need to expand production and make their shipping processes more efficient; efficiency being critical. The loading dock will make the delivery and shipping so much easier. "We'll be able to park a UPS truck here during the Christmas season when we need to and fill it up, which will be a huge help," Popenhagen said, adding "When we

did that before you couldn't get another truck in here and it took up so much of our customer parking."

The new addition will also allow them to store more supplies and stock more product on site. Before product and supplies were stored at the South Amana Bakery (in the coolers/ freezer there) and brought to the meat shop as needed, Tim Blattner, meat shop manager noted.

Here's more good news. The project came in under budget costing about \$200,000. "We used our Amana Society labor and resources. We did a lot of the work ourselves, in house, and utilized the Cedar Rapids Millwork to save dollars," Popenhagen said.

Last Christmas season the Amana Meat Shop shipped 28,768 holiday gifts. That's a 30 percent jump in holiday sales from 2014 when the Amana Meat Shop kicked its mail order business into high gear by adding staff and revamping its catalog and website. Since the window for holiday sales is short (more and more of us procrastinate) the meat shop staff has to be prepared to do the bulk of it in just 21 days. There have been plenty of days they shipped 2,000 plus packages in a single day.

The Amana Meat Shop mails catalogs to over 440,000 households and reaches as many as 644,000 people. Of course their website extends that reach even further. Last year the Amana Meat Shop had over \$5 million in sales.

"We have become a culture that shops on line," Popenhagen noted. "We certainly see that here, so we wanted to be in a position to serve that part of our business. Our goal is to increase our online and catalog sales."

Popenhagen said, "We are so fortunate that we have a great team here that works so well together. Everyone really pulls together to get the job done."
