
#### FOR YOUR INFORMATION DIOCESAN STIPENDS

### Easter Sunday of the Lord's Resurrection March 31, 2024

"Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead." Jn 20.8-9.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Jesus' death on the Cross, as great an act of love, of obedience, and of self-sacrifice as it is, would be incomplete without his Resurrection from death. Without the Resurrection from the dead, Jesus would not have conquered sin and death. Without the Resurrection from the dead, we would be unable to share in Jesus' victory over sin and death. This is why the passage from St. John's Gospel emphasizes that 'he **must** rise from the dead'.

This Scripture passage also reveals another important truth: it is not necessary to understand the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead in order to **believe** that Jesus is Risen from the dead.


The 'other disciple' went to the Tomb of Jesus because Mary Magdalene told Peter and him that the body of Jesus had been stolen. When he arrived, he saw an empty tomb and the burial clothes of Jesus placed to the side. 'Understanding' could easily lead to the conclusion that the body of Jesus had been stolen. But 'belief' assured the 'other disciple' that Jesus arose from death and was alive.

As disciples of Jesus, we may never understand the workings of Jesus' Resurrection and that is OK. We are disciples of Jesus because we believe that Jesus is Risen. Our belief is rooted in the testimony of eyewitness such as Mary Magdalene, Peter, and Thomas the Twin. Our belief is also rooted in the faith we saw in our Grandparents, parents, and those special people who have lived a life of hope even in the face of difficulties. But we believe especially because we have personally experienced Jesus' love, forgiveness, healing, and closeness.

This is what we celebrate during the Easter season: That Jesus, risen from the dead, chooses to be close to each of us and to daily lift us up and give us Joy.

He is Risen. He is Risen indeed!
