Each year on October 31, the Lutheran Church (along with other Protestant Churches) celebrates Reformation Day. According to tradition, the Reformation began on that day 1517 when Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses on the door of the castle church in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther did not set out to start a new church but to call the Catholic Church he deeply loved to change certain practices that were not in line with the gospel.

Luther understood that individuals and the whole church together are a work in progress. God never ceases to work in and through us that we may become the creation God intended. In 1521, in a treatise defending some of his views and writings, Luther wrote about a parable from Matthew 13, "...that of the leaven which the woman mixes in three measures of meal until it is leavened through and through. The new leaven is the faith and grace of the Spirit, who does not leaven the whole lump through at once, but gently and slowly makes us altogether like himself, new bread of God. This life, therefore, is not righteousness but growth in righteousness, not health but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise; we are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it; the process is not yet finished, but it is going on; this is not the end, but it is the road; all does not yet gleam with glory, but all is being purified."*

More than 500 years later, the Church continues to grow and change in order to more faithfully proclaim the gospel and to care for God's people in need. I am deeply grateful for you and for the ways we have worked together as Christ Lutheran Church to share the love of God with our community in the midst of our ever-changing world. As the last year and a half has brought about many changes in our congregation, so will the coming months and years. I look forward to continuing to seek new ways to love God and God's people with you!
