
Koonta-Kir

Letilier blasts the competition at Cannon Creek Enduro

Leigh Letilier on his factory supported, FMF, Wulf Sports, RK Chain, Sunstar, Scotts, Mike's Machine, Dunlop, Letko Competition Cycles sponsored KTM, bested the regular AA riders on the Black Jack Enduro Circuit by seconds. The second Annual Cannon Creek Enduro enjoyed cool temperatures but suffered from incredibly dusty conditions that worsened as the 180 riders left the start line. The AA riders circled the 40 mile first loop with a two minute point drop on the extremely rocky, tight woods course. The start of the second loop had them all even, separated by only seconds. These scores would hold as the clocks were found to be off and the second loop checks reverted to observed status. Steve Leivan held on to second AA on his Surdyke Yamaha of Marionville, M/C Stuff, Pro-Action, Answer, Sprocket Specialist, Dunlop, Mike's Machine, Camel Bak, Scott, RK chain sponsored Yamaha WR-250.

The other nice thing is that they did check in and out of test sections taking away the risk it factor of some people going into a section early.

The second loop proved to be a different story as the key time got off somehow and checks eight through twelve had to be thrown out. They all had to ride it as the checks reverted to "observed status" but no points could be awarded. A testiment to the course maybe? . . .I didn't hear anyone complain too loudly. I can understand that . . . one loop was enough for me!

After putting on this kind of event for several years . . .I understand how things can go wrong. It's a logistical nightmare to do one of these . . .and amazing that so many go off at all. The Sho-Me Trailriders did an excellant job of course preperation and the amount of work that went into this event was apparent. Guy's . . .put it behind you, it was a good event! I'm looking forward to next year!

I had already talked about CHADWICK . . .and then I recieved this info from **Jim Voyles,**head Chadwick Forest Ranger, and knew I had to include this info. "If" the dollars are going to go back into Chadwick in the form of trail maintenance and other improvements . . . this has to be a good thing!


Change, that's the name of the game. Trails change, vegetation changes, and policy changes. Hopefully, some of the these changes are for the better. Chadwick has historically not been funded as we would like to see it, where we have enough funds to do all the work we would like in trail maintenance. This may possibly change in the future. Chadwick has been proposed as a pilot area for user fees for other than camping. In other words, a fee will be charged for use of the trails. This may not sound good to some people accustomed to riding for free, however, there will be benefits to the users. The proposal would return 80% of the money collected to be used in the area. This could amount to a substantial amount depending on use and how the fees are set. The current thinking is for an annual user permit to be sold and a sticker permanently attached to the bike or 4-wheeler. The permit would be good for a year. The fee would run in the neighborhood of from \$20. to \$40. They would be for sale by mail or from Forest Service workers in the area. Most of this is preliminary at this point with details to be worked out if the proposal is implemented.

I thought this would be an opportunity to let users know of this proposal. Any comments will be welcome.


