DESCRIPTION: This is a RARE find. 1963 was the only year Pearson made the Stallion in this design and hardwood combination. It was simply a shorter version of the iconic Pinto. Great looking and performing refurbished recurve. The riser is in excellent minty condition. The limbs not so much. The limbs show considerable wear and tear and some discoloration. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in good condition. No drilled holes. No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing or stress cracks; a few faint stress lines, some extending past the riser fade-outs. On two separate occasions I put this bow to a stress test (held at full draw for 18 hours to make sure the old glues still held and the stress lines would not expand or fail. I have also shot this bow a number of times without issue. It is a remarkably good shooter. Decal is a reproduction.
