

Welcome to Pecos Conference 2017

Rowe Mesa, New Mexico

- Site Layout** Conference tents and camping areas are along a 1/3 mile gravel road (FR 124H) east of State Road 34. The gravel road through the conference site and camping areas is a narrow, single lane – please drive slowly. Obey the posted signs and directions of our parking volunteers.
- Camping** Toilets are available in the camping areas and near the conference tents. Small trash cans are located throughout the camping areas, but please dispose of recyclables and large trash bags, in the dumpsters near the conference tents. A recyclable dumpster for plastic, steel, aluminum, and paper (no glass), is available adjacent the trash dumpster. Please clean up your camping area when you depart. Campers must vacate by 3:00 pm on Sunday, August 13.
- Tent Campers** Dispersed camping for tents is in the meadows and junipers directly east of the conference tents, and along both sides of the gravel road running through the conference site. **Vehicles for tent campers must be parked within 30 feet of the gravel road, per National Forest policy, but you should set up tents beyond that distance.** Please pull off the gravel road to park, but **check for ground clearance!** The meadow is uneven in this area, with ruts and tree stumps, etc. Please keep food in secure containers to discourage wildlife.
- RVs - Trailers** RVs and trailers will be accommodated beyond the tent camping areas along the south side of the gravel road in the meadows and junipers, and further east in the adjacent fenced pasture (the fenced pasture area is more level than the meadow areas and is suggested for those who prefer a quieter camping experience). Please pull off the gravel road to park, but **check for ground clearance!** The meadow is uneven in this area, with ruts and tree stumps, etc. Those camping in RVs and trailers are requested to turn off generators between 10pm and 6am.
- Potable Water** A 2,000 gallon potable water truck will be centrally located in the camping areas adjacent the gravel road.
- Fires** There are currently no fire restrictions in effect on the Santa Fe National Forest and Rowe Mesa. Please refrain from building individual fire rings and consider shared fire rings for several adjacent campers. Fire pans and grills are allowed.
- Pets** Pets are welcome at the conference and camping areas, but must be on a leash or restrained at all times. Please clean up after your dog in the conference and camping areas.
- Lost - Found** Items found at the conference should be turned in at the Pecos information and souvenir table in the vendor tent. Lost items can also be claimed at the table.
- Food** Mobile food service by Tres Colores on Friday and Saturday beginning at 8:30am offering Mexican lunch items adjacent the conference tents.
- Silent Auction** A silent auction to raise funds for the Cordell-Powers prize fund will be held in the vendor tent from 10am Friday through the close of the auction during the Saturday lunch break. Please bring your items to donate to the vendor tent any time after 8am Friday.
- Tours Sunday** Tour sign-ups start Friday at 8am in the vendor tent.

From the conference site go right (north) on County Road 34, 3.5 miles, turn left on State Road 63, 1 mile to Rowe, turn right and continue on State Road 63 north 6 miles to the intersection of State Road 50 in Pecos, turn left on State Road 50 and drive about ¼ mile to the Pecos Valley Medical Center is on the right side on State Road 50.
