The Richmond Council, Navy League of the United States is holding a ceremony on Wednesday, June 2, 2021 at 10:30 AM at the Virginia War Memorial to recognize the 50th anniversary of the promotion of Samuel G. Gravely, Jr. to the rank of Admiral. Admiral Gravely rose from the rank of Seaman to Vice Admiral. He was the first African American to command a US Navy warship (THEODORE E. CHANDLER DD 717), the first African American to command an American warship under combat conditions (TAUSSIG DD 746), the first African American to command a major naval warship (JOUETT CG 29), the first African American admiral, the first African American to rise to the rank of Vice Admiral, and the first African-American to command a U.S. Fleet (Commander, US 3rd Fleet). The Navy honored Admiral Gravely with the naming of the destroyer USS SAMUEL G. GRAVELY JR. (DDG-107).

A proclamation issued by Governor Ralph Northam that designates Jane 2, 2021 as Admiral Samuel Gravely, Jr. Day will be read and presented to crew members of the USS GRAVELY.
