The origin of World Communion

In 1933, a Pittsburgh pastor, Hugh Thompson Kerr, had a unique idea. What if churches all around the world celebrated Holy Communion on the same Sunday? He contacted leaders of various denominations worldwide. His idea was met with such warm enthusiasm that celebrating the sacrament on the first Sunday of October is now an annual affair. It unites Christians throughout the world, or in the words of the popular hymn:

In Christ there is no east or west, In Him no south or north; But one great fellowship of love Throughout the whole wide earth.

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. Matthew 6:21

Dear Folks,

Just as the changing color of the leaves and the cooler temperatures mark the end of summer and the beginning of the fall season, so there are predictable signs within the church that it is fall. Within worship, our lessons highlight God's concern for the needs of the world. We hear the call of Jesus to serve others with compassion and mercy. It is an invitation to consider the blessings of our lives and how we can share those blessings with others.

As committee work gears up in the fall, each committee also begins to form their budgets for 2020. Looking at past expenditures and considering what will be needed next year, each committee carefully and faithfully considers their financial needs. Part of every committee discussion is not only "what do we need," but also "is there anywhere we can cut." This doesn't even count the personal donations committee members make for a special event or project. At the heart this committee work is the desire to be faithful stewards of the resources we have and to reach out in service to others. When the Committees have submitted their work, the Treasurer collates the requests of each committee to form the larger church budget. The Finance Committee takes a comprehensive look at what will be needed as well as considers staff salaries and total income requirements. The proposed budget is presented to the Church Council for review. It is the Church Council's task to approve the budget for the congregation's consideration at the November Congregational Meeting. The 2020 budget becomes official at the Congregational Meeting upon a positive vote.

While each committee is working with the Treasurer to build the 2020 budget, the Stewardship Committee goes into high gear to highlight the call to stewardship within our congregation. Through Temple talks and the Time and Talent sheets, the committee invites us to consider our stewardship of time, talent and treasure. Our congregation has been blessed with faithful stewards over the years and this continues to be the case. To highlight this faithful giving and to say, "Thank You!" the Stewardship Committee is providing a made-to-order breakfast on Sunday, November 10th, following the 10am service. Please mark your calendars to attend this fellowship event.

The Fall also brings the Time and Talent Sheet for the coming year. Every member is invited to consider how they might share of their time and talents. In sharing what we have, we heed Jesus' call to serve others in the name of Christ.

As you consider your financial support as well as your giving of time and talents, please pray. Pray that God may direct you in loving service. Pray for the many members who do the work of our congregation's ministry and consider joining them. Pray for the partners in ministry we have – the Council of Churches, the NEPS and wider church, and the many social agencies within our communities with whom we work. Pray that we might always be faithful in our work.
