CCA Town Hall on Bond Issue Monday Feb. 7 in Middle

Monday, Feb. 7 at 6:30 p.m. at the Amana Elementary School in Middle, a town hall meeting will be held to explain and address questions about the upcoming Clear Creek Amana schools bond issue vote to be held March 1. The vote is to approve the issuance of \$65 million in bonds by the CCA School District.

Additionally, town hall meetings will be held Feb. 5 at 10 a.m. at Tiffin Elementary School and Feb. 8 at 6:30 p.m. at North Bend Elementary.

According to the CCA's website should the ballot pass the CCA school district will use the \$65 million raised to:

· Build a new 600 student elementary school near Coralville.

· Improve existing playground spaces at the district elementary buildings.

• Build a Fine Arts addition to the Middle School.

• Build a Fine Arts and Career/ Technical Vocation addition to the CCA High School.

· Replace the Middle School roof.

· Make related site improvements to the CCA Middle and High Schools.

A 60 percent majority "yes" vote on the ballot is required for it to pass.

As per the website, "The district will maintain the current tax rate of 17.059. Our growth is not only in student enrollment but also in the commercial and residential tax base, which allows us to keep a fairly stable tax rate."

The ten-year enrollment estimates predict that the school district will have 4,500 students by 2032. In other words, the district will grow by about 150 to 200 students per year. These district growth projections were made by RSP and Associates, a public education planning firm hired by the CCA School District board.

are of men who would, after leaving the community, bring their children back to be raised by relatives after the mother died.

I remember being told of one such story by one "orphaned girl" herself.

She was the youngest of three children. Her older siblings had married and really did not have the means of taking in another child, especially a preteen, so the father brought her to Middle to live with a maiden aunt. He then left and was never heard from again until this girl had grown and had a family of her own.

Her husband did the research and found her father's resting place. She would name her son after him.

I think the oddest stories concerns one of my great grandmothers. She and her younger son were pregnant and had sons about the same age.

The younger sister died so my great grandmother nursed and raised nursed and raised both boys as her own, who were both ironically named Wilhelm.

The widower left the community to seek his fortune in Kansas City during this time.

About the time the boys had finished school the one Wilhelm's father returned to claim his son and take him back to Missouri while the other Wilhelm was told to move to Amana and learn to become a store manager.

Both men kept in touch as did their descendents who ironically had two girls named Barbara.

The mother, meanwhile was left in Homestead to live out her days with her husband and daughter.

Perhaps in the end few of us will be remembered as well as the many women mentioned thoughout history, but we all somehow leave our own mark on history if only it is to be the woman behind the man, pushing him into making history.

Election Day Registration took effect on January 1, 2008. This means you may now register at your precinct on Election Day if you have moved. If you plan to register on Election Day, you will need to provide proof of identity (photo ID), proof of residency (your current address in the precinct), and sign an oath. This process will take extra time at the polling place. Voters are still encouraged to preregister by Friday February 14, 2022 by 5:00 P.M. in the auditor's office if your residence has changed.

Voters are required to **provide an approved form of identification** at the polling place before they may receive and cast a ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered or who have changed precincts also may be required to provide proof of resi
