Editorial ...

MY SHEEP KNOW MY VOICE

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me." John 10: 27.

It seems that our world of today is so full of sounds and voices and confusion. We have TV, radio, stereos, tape decks, sound equipment of all descriptions, traffic noise, the sound of people rushing to and fro and other sounds of all kinds. It seems the very air is saturated with sounds and its hard to find a quiet place. And yet it is so very true that we hear what we want to hear.

The story is told of a naturalist that was walking the streets of New York City with a lifetime resident of that great metropolis. As they rounded a corner the naturalist stopped and listened and said "I hear the chirp of a cricket." His companion began to laugh and answered, "You've got to be kidding! With all the noise on this busy corner and you think you hear a cricket!" But he followed him down some stairs leading into a basement, and sure enough in a dark little corner at the bottom of the stairs their flashlight revealed a lone cricket chirping its little song. The New Yorker asked in disbelief, "But how could you hear that?" The naturalist said, "come back on the street and I'll show you how." When they reached the street he took a quarter from his pocket and let it drop to the cement below and nearly every passerby turned his head to look when the sound of money dropping reached their ears. They were all accustomed to that sound. The man exclaimed, "It makes all the difference in what your ear is tuned to hear. Mine is listening for the cricket."

Oh, what a message that man preached. Amid all the confusion of voices and messages that our ears are subjected to today, we, His sheep, can single out the voice of our Shepherd, the Risen, Lord. The song writer put it this way, "I hear the risen Saviour say, Follow me, Follow me, Follow Me. His voice is calling all the day, Follow me, follow me, follow me." Jesus told us that in the last days there would be false prophets and many would say here is Christ and there is Christ and many would claim to be the Christ, but he warned us not to follow after them and to take heed that no man deceive us. We can hear the master's voice above all others if we truly love him. Did you ever notice when a group of small children are playing together that when one of them is hurt and starts to cry or calls out "Mama" that invariably the right mother is the first to hear that cry of distress. Jesus knows his own and not only do we know and hear his voice but He says "I know them." The Bible tells us that our Risen Saviour is at the right hand of God interceding for us. He's praying for you and me. He is alive and alive for evermore. And we His sheep can hear His voice. It is so different from all the rest. It soothes the broken heart, it encourages the down-hearted, it reproves and rebukes for all wrong-doing, and its sound is all we need to see us through the longest, darkest, loneliest night of our lives. Have you heard the Shepherd's voice today. Listen for it. You can if you're one of His sheep.

URGENT OR DEFAULT

Christians should have an interest in legislation, particularly that which affects the Lord's work. Identical bills have now been introduced into both houses of Congress calling for termination by January 1976 of existing tax exemptions and deductions from income tax. The Senate Bill is No. S-3657 and the House Bill is No. HR-15230, and they are titled:

Tax Policy Review Act of 1973

Section 306 of the bills would eliminate the tax-free parsonage allowance under the existing law. This would penalize churches who own residences for the minister and preachers who own their own homes. It would place a much heavier tax burden on the minister and on the church.

Section 312 of the bills would terminate charitable deductions (such as church contributions, and gifts to colleges, hospitals, and children's homes). If you give \$1,000.00 to the church a year and are in the 25% tax bracket, passage of these bills would cost you additional \$250.00 a year in income taxes.

Strong, but courteous, objection to this legislation should be addressed to our own individual State Senators.

Churches have no lobbying force in Congress and, unless Christians speak up, they stand to lose immensely by SILENCE and DEFAULT.

We urge you to also write your protest to the sponsors of the bills, Rep. Wilbur Mills, (D. Arkansas) and Sen. Mike Mansfield (D. Montana).

THE VACANT TOMB

"He is not here... HE IS RISEN!"

Luke 24: 3 "And they entered in, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus."

These devout women, followers of Jesus, who came with their spices for the anointing, the last act of love and respect they could render for their precious Lord, without doubt expected to find the body in the tomb. Little did they realize that the entire plan of God's salvation for Adam's fallen race hinged on the fact that the tomb on this first Easter morning must be vacant, and the body of our Lord Jesus must not be found.

Oh, the awfulness of the thought — What if they had found the body and He had not risen as He said He would; then our faith and hope would have been in vain, and we would yet be in our sins. But, thank God, early on that morning they found the stone rolled away and the two men stood by in shining garments, and proclaimed "Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen! What wonderful news for the women to hear for they feared that the body had been stolen.

After Adam's fall in the garden, God promised the Saviour; the seed of the women would bruise the head of the serpent. (Gen. 3: 15) Four thousand years man waited for the fullness of God's salvation. First God dealt with the patriarchs through their conscience, then God gave to Moses the law, which would be a schoolmaster to lead us to Christ and grace. How in these ages men must have waited and longed for grace and truth. Perhaps David, the man after God's own heart, after the sins of passion and lust had taken control and

in a few hours time he became an adulterer and a murderer, expresses ths cry of the human heart best in his words, "My sin is ever before me, purge me with hyssop; wash me and I shall be whiter than snow, create in me a clean heart, and renew a right spirit within me." These things would not and could not be accomplished until He would come, "Who would save His people from their sins."

The Prophets spoke of the plan of redemption, and gave types and shadows of One, who was to come. The last writer of the Old Testament speaks of the Lord whom ye seek shall suddenly come to His temple. But even with this last book having been closed for over 400 years, God had one who had extracted a promise of the Holy Ghost that he would not see death till he had seen the Lord's Christ. Simeon waited not in vain, for God had chosen a virgin, and she had been over shadowed of the Holy Ghost and had conceived. She was of the right lineage, had been brought by taxation to the right city, and had given birth to Him, of whom the angel had said, "He shall be called Jesus, for He shall save His people from their sins. The Shepherds heard the news that a Saviour was born, but this was only the beginning. The Son of God became the Son of Man; He became flesh and blood that He might condemn sin in the flesh.

One day a stranger came to John to be baptized, for John said I knew Him not, and John says I have need to be baptized of you, but the stranger answers, "Suffer it to be so now." Then as He came up out of the water, John saw the Spirit descending and remaining on Him, then he could say, "and I saw and bare record that this is the Son of God."

From His baptism He was led (driven) to the wilderness and tempted of the devil forty days, after which **He** returns in the power of the Spirit. He now comes with power over every sickness, diseases, demons, storms at sea and above all power over sin. The message from the heart of God brings the hope for fallen men of every station in life. In some three short years His Gospel changed the lives of millions of people. Nations of the world felt the impact of the Words of Life that fell from His lips.

Through all this He was denied and sold by His own, and stood before Pilot to be examined and cross-examined. And although Pilot confessed, "I find no fault in Him, He was turned over to a blood thirsty mob and crucified. I remember His words "For this hour am I come into the world." So it wasn't primarily for the birth, miracles and joys that He came, but to pay redemption's price, and become our sacrificial Lamb upon God's altar to complete the plan of redemption from sin. The power of the "sting of death" must be broken. So man can sing "Death hath no terrors for the blood bought ones, Oh, Glory Hallelujah to The Lamb." Jesus and the resurrection are one and the same thing. You can't preach Jesus without the Resurrection; nor can you preach the Resurrection without Jesus, for Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life." Praise God the tomb was found VACANT! It was only borrowed for three days. He is not here !! HE IS RISEN !!!

Praise God from whom all blessings flow! I am so glad He inhabits eternity and says. "I am the Lord. I change not." Mal. 3:6 His word is the same and His power is the same

We are facing conditions our Bible has told us would come to pass in the end time. Bro. Parham and many of the ministers of by-gone days told us the time would come when our land titles and money would be worthless. We are beginning to see these things come to pass.

There are shortages of almost everything. One of the gravest is the shortage of food. Many of the things the Bible tells us of are manifest as pestilence and famine which are being experienced more and more.

Labor troubles at home and embargos of vital resources from other nations have us in a position that could bring

> a shortage of food and many vital necessities in a short period of time.

A man told me he had bought seventy-five chickens and over one hundred pounds of bacon and was ready for a shortage. How foolish! He had it in his deep freeze, and hadn't thought how it could spoil in a few days if the electricity was cut off. As the song says, "We dare not trust the sweetest frame but wholly lean on Jesus Name." Since we are facing these conditions someone will say, "What are we going to do?" I will give you some Bible examples of similar conditions. Heb. 3:17 and 18. "Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labor of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat: the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls: yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation."

> The One who said, "Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world," will see his faithful ones through. Matt. 28:20, For He hath said, "I will never leave thee nor forsake thee." Heb. 13:5.





pot of oil. Elisha told her to borrow many vessels and start pouring the oil until all the vessels were filled. Then Elisha told her to sell the oil and pay the debt — and live on the rest. The God we serve has proven many times that He is able for any condition that may arise.

In Matt. 15:32-38 there is a New Testament account of how Jesus fed four thousand men, beside women and children, with seven loaves of bread and a few fish, and had seven baskets of food left. In Matt. 6:36-44 Jesus performed a miracle by using a little lad's lunch of five loaves and two fishes to feed five thousand men and had twelve baskets of food left. It should thrill our hearts and increase our faith to read these wonderful truths of God. Romans 8: 35-39

35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

36 As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long: we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.

37 Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.

38 For I am persuaded that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come,

39 Nor height, or depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Not anything that happens can separate us from the love of God. What a wonderful assurance we have! We must look to Him with all the faith and grace that God gives us.

Ps. 121:1 and 2 "I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help. My help cometh from the Lord, which made heaven and earth." God is the only one who can help us, He is our only hope.

Matt. 6:19-21 "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt and where thieves do not break through nor steal: for where your treasure is, there will be your heart also." It is time to set our affections on heavenly things. Do not let worldly things rob you of your hope of seeing Christ, and being like Him.

It is high time we consider Col. 3:1-4 very diligently. "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set you affection on things above, not on things on the earth. For ye are dead and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory."

In this day of affluence, many seem to think that material things are the most important, but Jesus tells us in Luke 12:15 that we should take heed and beware of covetousness: for a man's life consistent not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth.

I hope and pray that many have come to the realization that this age is coming to a close. If we fail God by putting our faith in the wisdom of man and worldy possessions, we will go down to perdition and death.

WHAT EASTER CAN MEAN FOR YOU

in a basket? Family reunion? A welcome end to a long, dreary winter? Signs of new life in nature?

Or does it speak of new spiritual life? Does it mean the resurrection of Christ and the Christian's assurance of eternal life?

I was reading what William Jennings Bryan, famous orator and three-time nominee for the Presidency of the United States, said on the subject. Here is what Easter meant to him:

"Christ gave us proof of immortality. And yet it would hardly seem necessary that one should rise from the dead to convince us that the grave is not the end.

"To every created thing God has given a tongue that proclaims a resurrection. If the Father deigns to touch with divine power the cold and pulseless heart of the buried acorn and make it burst forth from its prison walls, will He leave neglected in the earth the soul of man, made in the image of his Creator?

"If He stoops to give the rosebush, whose withered blossoms float upon the autumn breeze, the sweet assurance of another springtime, will He refuse the world of hope to the sons of men when the frost of another winter comes? If matter, mute and inanimate, though changed by force of nature into a multitude of forms, can never die, will the spirit of man suffer annihilation when it has paid a brief visit, like a royal guest, to the tenement of clay? No. I am as sure that there is another life as I am that I live today.

slumbered for more than 3,000 years in an Egyptian tomb. beyond the grave depends on our relationship to Jesus. As I looked at them, this thought came into my mind. If the resurrected Christ.

HAT DOES EASTER MEAN TO YOU? New clothes? Eggs one of those grains had been planted upon the banks of the Nile the year after it grew, and all its lineal descendants planted and replanted from that time until now, its progeny would today be plentiful enough to feed all the millions of the world.

> "There is in the grain of wheat an invisible something which has the power to discard the body that we see, and from earth and air to fashion a new body so much like the old one that we cannot tell one from another.

> "If this invisible germ of life in the grain of wheat can thus pass unimpaired through 3,000 resurrections, I shall not doubt that my soul has the power to clothe itself with a new body, suited to its new existence, when this earthly frame has crumbled into dust."

> This truth, implicit in nature, is explicitly stated in the Bible. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live" (John 11:25). The joys of Christian living will not end at death but will be multiplied to last forever, Psalm 16:11 states. "In thy [God's] presence is fulness of joy: at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore."

> This hope of a better life beyond the grave is contingent upon our faith in God's Son, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, as it is written, "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life" (John 3:36).

Easter can mean the beginning of eternal life for you, if you will accept Jesus as your personal Saviour. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son. that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but "In Cairo I secured a few grains of wheat that had have everlasting life" (John 3:16). IT WAS SUNDAY EVENING, and a handful of men were hiding in an upstairs room. They were utterly miserable; they were puzzled and depressed. In their fear they had bolted the door.

The bottom had fallen out of their world. They had given their all in loyalty to their Leader; everything had been centered in Him, and now—He was dead.

His grave was in a garden close by. One more idealist removed and with Him all His grand, but unfulfilled, promises.

A few weeks later these same men were on trial before those who were responsible for the death of their Leader. The "crime" with which they were charged was that of preaching about Him. Neither beating nor the threat of death was sufficient to keep them quiet. They said, when threatened by their accusers, "We cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). Treated like criminals, accused of madness, charged with being drunk, hounded from city to city—these they counted experiences in which to rejoice.

What had happened? Why this tremendous change? They believed that their Leader Jesus Christ was alive! They had seen Him. He had spoken to them. And wherever they went, thousands believed them. Finally their enthusiasm stormed and won many of the cities of the Roman Empire.

Alive for evermore! That was the amazing news which captured the ancient world: and that is the message which has changed the lives of millions ever since.

The resurrection message is one which can revolutionize your life. What is wrong with most of us is that we are failing to be what in our better moments we want to be. We have discovered that our best endeavors are paralyzed by the tendency toward evil which is part of our nature. But the living Christ can save us from this. "If thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved" (Romans 10:9).

And the future? Many are like the disciples of Christ after His crucifixion—puzzled, bewildered, and almost afraid to face life. Would it not make a tremendous difference if you had the friendship and help of Jesus Christ? That is precisely what you may know. His promise to all who believe in Him is, "Lo, I am with you alway" (Matthew 28:20).

But it's not only that a living Christ enables us to face life—He helps us to face death. We do not like to think about death. It's a gloomy subject, and we hope that it won't happen. But we have to face it.

For the believer in Jesus Christ, death is not gloomy, certainly not tragic. His conquest of death is the pledge of ours: "Because I live, ye shall live also" (John 14:19). For the believer in Jesus Christ, it is an enemy defeated and despoiled of its power. It is the gateway to a fuller life.

"I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). That is the kind of life He promises now. "And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish" (John 10:28).

Why not prove with all those who have believed in Christ that this is the truth.
