Bi-weekly reports provide parents with additional insight– the teachers will tell you who your child is working with and what they are working on in the classroom. Classroom A

Hello to all the new and returning families! All the children are making a nice transition into our classroom. It is nice to see the returning children help the new children become familiar with the classroom routines and schedule. During the past two weeks we have been spending a lot of time on Grace and Courtesy – learning how to greet each other, get a teacher's attention, how to choose a cork activity, clean up, and then return the work to the shelf so a classmate may use it. We also are learning how to work with other and respecting each other's work space within the classroom. It has been a nice start to the school year. *Andrea, Alka and Sandhya*

Classroom B

We are thrilled to be back for a new school year at Sunrise Montessori! The beginning of the school year always emphasizes Grace and Courtesy lessons, including learning the three classroom rules: talking in a low voice, hands to ourselves and walking feet. The children have also practiced how to walk on the line, how to watch a lesson and getting a teacher's attention. The teachers will begin to open the classroom shelves gradually in the next few weeks.

Currently the children are being introduced to Practical Life, the foundation of the Montessori environment, which includes areas of scooping, squeezing, twisting, grasp and control, rolling and folding, stringing, and care of the environment and self. This area helps children develop order, coordination, concentration and independence. As the year progresses the children will learn more of the advanced Practical Life skills including pouring activities with water, cleaning wet spills and using the Zipper and Button frames.

Thank you to the parents who have signed up for volunteering in our classroom including parent Read-Aloud, snacks and special trades and skills. If you haven't signed up and are interested, please tell a teacher. The teachers will be contacting parents to begin volunteering in October once the children are settled with the daily routine.
