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**Special Note:** The preferred method of transliterating is to use upper case English letters, except for the four Greek letters requiring two English letters in the transliteration. In these cases, the second of the two English letters should be in lower case. This is true also of the three letters containing iota-subscripts. The iota subscript should be written in lower case as a subscript.
