assisted by Adam Moro to pull out the original motor. The original motor and transmission will go to the La Verne City Yard for storage. Since I am completely ignorant of automotive mechanics, I asked Erik to explain the next steps in getting the truck into functional shape. Here's the list of what you'll get for your donation:



- \checkmark Transport motor & transmission to the City Yard
- Mock up a new motor & transmission
- Remove the cab & fenders
- ✓ Pull apart the chassis
- ✓ Sandblast the frame, locate cracks, then weld them
- ✓ Remove tires & axles
- Install new brake booster assembly (power-assisted hydraulics)
- ✓ Repair doors, side mirrors, etc. for functionality
- \checkmark Recover the bench seat
- ✓ Re-build the wood flatbed; install side rails & seats
- ✓ Final cleaning & rust removal
