## **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

On March 11 Jewish people around the world will begin celebrating the Festival of Purim. People often think of this as a joyous holiday when children dress in costume and attend carnivals.

But, Purim is so much more than that. It is a holiday that closely mirrors the values of NCJW. The National Council of Jewish Women is a grassroots organization of volunteers and advocates who turn progressive ideals into action. Inspired by Jewish values, NCJW strives for social justice by improving the quality of life for women, children and families and by safeguarding individual rights and freedoms.

How you might ask does Purim resemble NCJW's values? On Purim the Megillah (Book of Esther) is read. It tells the story of a strong (nasty perhaps?) woman who saved her Jewish people from being exterminated by the Jew-hating Prime Minister, Haman. Our Section has many strong women dedicated to not only saving and bettering Jewish lives, but all lives.

Also on Purim it is customary to give gifts of money to at least two poor people as well as sending gifts of two kinds of food to at least one person. The giving of gifts to the poor during the days of Purim is prescribed in order to recall the brotherly love which Esther awoke among all Jews.

Giving to and helping the poor is what our Section does. This year our three main focuses are homeless veterans and their families, Jewish Free Loan, and helping the resettlement local refugees.

So when you are enjoying your Hamantaschen remember to also think about the true meaning of the Festival of Purim and of your involvement in National Council of Jewish Woman.

Our dreams for an all-inclusive United States and an ideal state of Arizona are turning into nightmares. Every day I find myself falling into despair as I watch the laws and repeals of existing laws and orders that are being planned in the State Legislature and in Congress. I know many of you are feeling the same. *The best antidote to misery and gloom is hope and action.*

Realistically, the ball is not in our court right now, but we can continue to make our calls, write our emails, go to demonstrations, and respond to Action Alerts. If you do not know which Congressional District (Federal) or Legislative District (State) you reside in, please contact me or go to [www.redistricting.org/districtlocation/](http://www.redistricting.org/districtlocation/), where you can insert your address and both districts will be displayed. Please explore the AZLEG.gov website: There are descriptions of the bills, a legislative calendar, agendas for hearings and votes.

Some committee hearings and actual House and Senate sessions are live-streamed on the website, to give transparency to the process. Additionally, some of the same are on Channel 123 throughout the day, and in evening they show older events. A Sunday morning news show, "Sunday Square Off," is on at 8:00am on Channel 12 with host Brahm Resnick. There are interesting guests and commentaries on what is happening locally.

Watch for an announcement to go down to the Capitol to sign up for RTS (Right to Speak). And we hope you will join us for an "out and about" day at the legislature, details TBA. Also, there will be a postcard event with cards going to President Trump in March and again, on April 15th. Stay tuned. And don't forget to keep up with NCJW on Facebook and Twitter.

## **THE REFUGEE EXPERIENCE: OUR JOURNEY TO COMPASSION AND UNDERSTANDING**

It is hard to believe that March is here already and we are putting the final touches on the annual NCJW awareness luncheon preparations!

Last summer our committee started talking about a program focusing on immigration. That was before the Arizona presidential preference election was held, before the Republican and Democratic Conventions and before the elections in November. We thought we should learn the pros and cons about immigration reform since it has been an issue here in our border state.

Sydel Maher, an NCJW member and retired federal employee, moved to Scottsdale and began working for IRC's refugee resettlement program. At our first meeting, she helped us begin our education process. She explained that immigration is a very complex issue, beginning with the differences between immigrants (legal and illegal), asylum seekers and refugees. She described the vetting process that legal immigrants go through and the length of time that can take. Then she described the vetting process refugees must go through and how long THAT process can take. There was no question about it -- we realized that we could only look at part of the immigration issue, and the part we felt we need to educate ourselves and our community about was the refugee portion.

As a result of that initial committee meeting we formed partnerships with two resettlement agencies, the International Rescue Committee (IRC) and Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest (LSS). They gave us tours of their facilities, offered to work with us, helped us identify refugees who would be able to speak in front of a large group, and allowed us to talk to them in their offices. These are the women who will be with us on March 19<sup>th</sup>.

Our five panelists will have met with us many times prior to the luncheon. Remember, English is not their primary language or even their secondary language. Only one of them is comfortable with public speaking in English and she helps other refugees with their English. They have varying levels of education from their countries of origin -- from no formal education through a master's degree. Most of them have never told their stories before. We are delighted that they are willing to share the experiences that have brought them to Arizona. Each story is important, and each one is different.

We hope you will join us and bear witness to their stories. Please RSVP by March 10th. See details and contact information on the bulletin cover.

## **MARCH 2017 STANDDOWN**

The 2017 StandDown Arizona clothing drive and distribution was a giant success. This year, we served 1,949 veterans over the two days and it is estimated that 10 percent of those we assisted were women.

At StandDown, female veterans have a separate entryway so they don't have to stand in lines with the male vets. Eligibility, registration and bag check services were also available to women vets in this secured area on Thursday and Friday. When other services outside of the women's area were needed, a female escort was provided to the veteran so that she was not alone.

The number of women vets who attended the event has increased since last year. The children's clothing area, which was staffed by NCJW Arizona Section volunteers, served more than just the women vets; many dads came to us for assistance so they could provide for their children also. NCJW was thanked in the final report.

We especially want to thank our CRACK set up team on Wednesday. We had no idea what we were coming into and how much space we would have available. Lin Katzenstein, Debbie Jacobs, Rita Walton, Hannah Kaplan and Steve Gross were assisting the two of us with the sorting and moving and anything else we needed to accomplish.

Thursday brought great helpers again – Hannah Kaplan, Fran Richter, Susan Schesnol, Irene Magerman, Debby Finkel, and Naomi Spielman. We spoke with the vets, they shared their stories with us, we provided them with clothing, and we organized and reorganized the piles of clothes when needed.

Friday brought another group of wonderful helpful women – Joan Sacks, Sydell Ukeiley, Carol Consalvo, Lynn Schmelzer and Jude Chaskes. We gave away more clothing and packed up leftover items to be donated to UMOM, which provides clothes and shelter all year to the homeless vets. Working together, we should be able to decrease the numbers of homeless vets significantly.

This was a huge endeavor. We want to express our appreciation to all who donated, picked up clothing, gathered clothing and also allowed us to take a few hours off on Thursday and Friday to take a much-needed break for lunch! We forgot how stressful a full day of working and rush hour traffic can be.

## IT WAS STANDING ROOM ONLY AT NCJW'S FEBRUARY 21 MEETING

"We've never run out of EXTRA seats," said one of our committee members as she dragged in the last of the available chairs from another room. And those who came were not disappointed. Nicky Walker, our speaker from the International Rescue Committee in Phoenix, gave us a one-hour crash course on the global refugee situation, beginning with the difference between immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers. She covered all the bases, presented slides showing maps and statistics, explained the processes all refugees must go through before they are relocated, and answered dozens of questions – where refugees come from, how they are cleared at every step of their journey, and how some of them eventually get to Arizona. The purpose of the meeting was to give our members some background before we meet the five refugee women who will share their own stories with our members and guests at our March 19<sup>th</sup> luncheon.
