OCTOBER 1 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT THÉRÈSE OF THE CHILD JESUS, VIRGIN, DOCTOR: Thérèse entered the

Carmel of Lisieux at age 15. She held special devotions to the heart of Jesus and the spiritual Motherhood of Mary and is famous for her approach to life known as the 'little way' – fidelity in small things, trust and complete self-surrender to God. Known as the 'Little Flower', Thérèse died in 1897, was canonized in 1925, and was made a Doctor of the Church in 1997. She is a patroness of missions. As we begin World Mission Month, let us pray for the intercession of St. Thérèse to guide and protect all missionaries.

OCTOBER 4 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI:

Bernardone responded to a call to serve God and the poor. His zeal for God won many disciples who numbered 5000 by 1219. At Christmas 1223, Francis built a crêche, beginning the Christmas Crib custom which has spread throughout Christendom. His visionary leadership inspired thousands to lead lives of poverty, simplicity, and humble service, delighting in creation and consumed with love for Christ. Francis is also recognized as being the first to teach that the earth itself is holy. Francis died in 1226, was canonized in 1228, and is a patron of Italy and of ecologists.

OCTOBER 5 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT FAUSTINA KOWALSKA, VIRGIN: Born in the village of Glogowiec, near Lodz, in Poland in 1905, and dying in Krakow in 1938, Saint Faustina spent her short life amongst the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, generously conforming herself to the vocation she received from God and developing an intense spiritual life, rich in spiritual gifts and in faithful harmony with them. In the Diary of her soul, the sanctuary of her encounter with the Lord Jesus, she herself recounts what the Lord worked in her for the benefit of all: listening to him who is love and mercy she understood what no human wretchedness could measure itself against the mercy which ceaselessly pours from the heart of Christ. Thus she became the inspiration for a movement dedicated to

proclaiming and imploring Divine Mercy throughout the whole world. Canonized in the year 2000 by Saint John Paul II, the name of Faustina quickly became known around the world, thereby promoting in all the parts of the people of God, pastors and lay faithful alike, the invocation of Divine Mercy and its credible witness in the conduct of the lives of believers.

OCTOBER 6 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT BRUNO, PRIEST: About the year 1030, Bruno was born in Cologne, Germany. An eminent scholar, he became professor of Theology and Grammar at Rheims. In 1080, filled with the desire to live a contemplative life, he gave up his riches and, with six companions, began to live as a hermit. In 1084, the group was given land high in the Chartreuse mountains. This was the beginning of the Carthusian Order, of which Bruno was the founder, and of the great abbey which is its Motherhouse. In 1101, after founding a second monastery, he died, leaving no rule, but a spirit of prayerful simplicity which still lives on.
