I will be gone next weekend with some of our high school students as we attend a Steubenville Youth Conference in Rochester, MN. There will not be a daily Mass on Thursday or Friday. The Franciscan University of Steubenville, Ohio has a strong reputation in helping people grow in their faith as students and they do outreach by putting on youth conferences throughout the country. I attended a few of these while I was in high school and I have not attended one since then. Rev. Jordan Samson will be filling in for me. Rev. Samson is one of my classmates and he is helping with the 30 day retreat at Broom Tree this summer. His assignment is the director of the Newman Center at Northern State University in Aberdeen and pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in Westport. This past week marked one year of me being that pastor of Saint Wenceslaus parish and Saint John the Baptist parish. This past year has gone very quickly and I am glad to begin another year. In another month, I will celebrate 8 years of ordination to the priesthood. I feel like I have a good grasp of how things have gone in the past in both parishes and I look forward to what God will lead us towards.

I came across an article from social media this past week from 2016. I remember reading it when it first came out and it is still very relevant today. It is titled: "6 Things Children Learn When You Skip Mass on Sundays" and it was written by Becky Roach. I offer this for two reasons. The first is so that families can pass it on to friends and family members. The second is not to shame families that don't come often but to help invite them to more regular Mass attendance. This article could also be called '6 Things Anyone Learns When You Skip Mass on Sundays.' Her first point is: 'God is important, but not *that* important.' Her point here is to show that other activities such as sports, vacations, or family obligations easily step in the place of attending Sunday Mass. The second lesson that children learn is: 'God doesn't *really* mean what He says.' The third commandment is to keep holy the Lord's day and it is not up to us to pick and choose which commandments are worthy of following. The third lesson is: 'the Church doesn't *really* expect us to adhere to Her teachings.' This lesson is connected to the previous point and it emphasizes that we get to determine which of Jesus' teachings we follow instead of following all of them. The fourth lesson is: 'Mass is all about me and what I get out of it.' Our attendance at Mass is important because it provides an opportunity for us to give thanks to God for the past week and invite Him into the struggles that the past week brought to us. Larger than this opportunity is the reality that we give God what is due to Him. The fifth lesson is: 'When things are difficult/boring, I don't have to do them.' This lesson points to the point that if something is not easy or fun, we should not have to do them. Practicing for sports, playing games when you are on a losing streak, and doing things as adults that are not enjoyable must be done. The last lesson is: 'to doubt the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and the graces that come from receiving Him.' If we believe that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life, then we should do everything that we can to receive Jesus' Body and Blood.

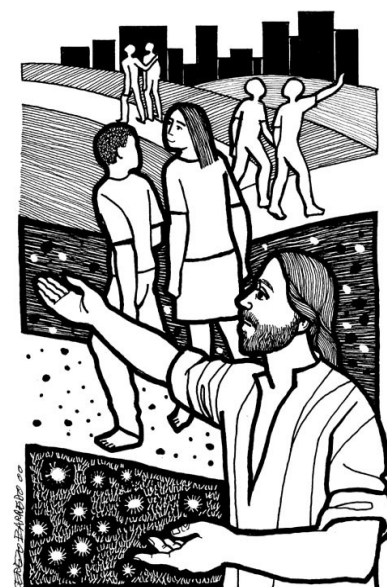
