Art students in all courses should have the following items, unless otherwise noted, by the **Monday after the first day of school**:

Sketchbook – spiral bound or hard cover - 8 ½" x 11" or 9" x 12"

Notebook or three ring binder with pockets

Additional requirements by course:

Applied Art: Items listed above. Students may be asked to bring in various inexpensive items throughout the year.

Photography: sketchbook can be smaller size, notebook with pockets, Camera (preferably a DSLR) with multi-functions and over 8 Megapixels, extra battery, battery charger, large capacity memory card, 32g flash drive, Optional: camera case, neck strap, extra lenses, protective lens, remote, tripod. Additional materials may be required

Ceramics I and Ceramics II: Items listed above, a set of pottery tools (optional)

Art I: Items listed above, drawing pencil set – 12 pencil set ranging from at least 4H to 6B graphite hardness, eraser, two poster boards (22"x 28") in any color, pencil box no larger than 5 1/2" by 8 1/2". Students may choose to bring their own markers or other drawing media.

Art II: Items listed above. Drawing pencil set – 12 pencil set ranging from at least 4H to 6B graphite hardness, two long handled paint brushes (½ " flat and ½ " round brushes) for acrylic paint, (additional assorted brushes optional), two 22" x 28" poster boards any color or a wallet style 23"x21" portfolio, eraser, a small plastic palette (preferably with a cover), pencil box no larger than 5 1/2" by 8 1/2".

Portfolio: Hardcover bound sketchbook. Drawing pencil set – 12 pencil set (4H to 6B) set of brushes for acrylics and a set for watercolors (sizes will be discussed in class), a kneaded eraser, a plastic palette an art supply box, 1" x 2" boards and cotton duck canvas (size to be determined in class), oil paint set with extra white (the school will have a basic starter set), small container of turpenoid, a for oils, portfolio (approximately 23"x 31"x 2"). Students may choose to bring in other drawing/painting media and additional materials and supplies will depend on the direction of the work chosen by the student.

AP 2D Studio: Hardcover bound sketchbook, Drawing pencil set – 12 pencil set ranging from at least 4H to 6B graphite hardness good quality oil/acrylic brush set (sizes to be determined) , drawing pens with a variety of tips (optional), art supply box, eraser, portfolio (approximately 23"x 31"x 2"). Students may choose to bring in other drawing/painting media and additional materials and supplies will depend on the direction of the work chosen by the student.

Please contact your teacher if there is any difficulty or hardship in getting these supplies. Most all supplies can be purchased at Art Coop, Hobby Lobby or Michaels, though many can be found at discount stores. Also, check on-line for coupons for Hobby Lobby and Michaels.

Graphic Design and Digital Media

All students registered for digital art classes (digital media: still images, animation or digital film production; graphic design I & II) must have a subscription to Adobe Creative Cloud for the length of the class (1 trimester). Students also need a working computer with a mouse and a flash drive. Graphic Design I & II students also need a sketch book (8.5X11 or 9x12, ~30 pages) and appropriate utensils.
