### **CLERGY COLUMN**

### Happy Lord's Day!

This is a little strange to be writing for the April 14th bulletin, but it's our first bulletin of the month, so the focus here will be the monthly devotion and saints for the month of April. This is also a double-bulletin as I'll be away for our annual Clergy Days in Bemidji, Monday evening through Thursday.

The month of April is dedicated to the Holy Spirit, the third Person of the Holy Trinity. In the Gospels Jesus speaks about a new Advocate whom he will send upon his departure from this world. Immediately prior to his Ascension into Heaven, he gives instructions to his disciples that they are to go and prepare for "power from on high" to be given them. Hopefully we know the rest of the story, but they go and pray for nine days before the Holy Spirit is given to them on the day of Pentecost, the fiftieth day after Easter Sunday. It is the Holy Spirit that launches them into the mission to make disciples of all nations, while also empowering them with different spiritual gifts for the sake of a successful mission. These spiritual gifts are called charisms, and we believe that each Christian receives at least one charism upon the reception of Baptism, fortified at Confirmation. These charisms are given by the Holy Spirit, who wants to launch us into the mission of making disciples of all nations. This, of course, includes each one of us in our parishes - the Holy Spirit has empowered you and me to go into our communities of Oklee, Goodridge, and Grygla to announce the Good News of what God has done in the Person of Jesus. We have been empowered to expand the Kingdom of God on earth - are we going to work for the Kingdom? May the Lord grant to us a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit as we seek to spread the Gospel to our three towns and the surrounding area.

There aren't many saints on the calendar for the month of April, at least not for the last half of April. The Church continues to celebrate the Easter season throughout the entire month, concluding with Pentecost on May 19th this year. Still, there are a couple of bigger saints toward the end of April. St. Catherine of Siena (April 29th) played a major role in the life of the Church when she was alive. At the time, the Pope was living in France for mostly political reasons and Catherine went and convinced him to move back to Rome - she must have been quite a force! She also had several mystical, deep encounters with Jesus and had a spiritual stigmata, which are the wounds of Jesus from the Cross. She was truly a great saint and is co-patroness of Europe. St. Mark (April 25th) also comes to us this month, the great Evangelist. He is understood to be a disciple of St. Peter, the first pope. Since he wasn't directly an Apostle of Jesus, he had to receive his information from someone else in order to be able to write his Gospel. While it is not an official teaching, many people suggest that his primary source was Peter - a reasonable thought considering Peter didn't write a Gospel. So, when we read the Gospel of Mark we also get into the mind of Peter a little bit. We'll be spending a lot of time in Mark's Gospel once we return to Ordinary Time.

My schedule this month is a little different. We have our annual Priest Conference this coming week, so I will be away all week and back by Sunday. Bishop Cozzens asked me to take a spirituality class in Illinois - it's three separate weeks each year for three years - so I will be away April 26th-May 4th. Msgr. Tim McGee will be here to offer Masses April 28th.

May the Lord give you his peace! Fr. Bryan
