Marion's Fishing Corner

Here comes the sun.....

It feels like summer is finally here. The days are getting longer, and air temps are definitely on the rise. So once again it is time to get serious about protecting ourselves (as much as we can) from the harmful rays of the sun. A few months ago, I wrote about having skin cancer removed from my neck area. Since then, I've had the procedure done again, this time from my left forearm area. Many years of not taking sun protection seriously are taking their toll.

According to research, as many as one in every five Americans will develop skin cancer in their lifetime and of course, summertime is when we run the highest risk of exposure. But there have been some recent innovations in sun protection that should help us lessen the harmful effects. Sunscreen lotions have improved, giving greater UV protection for a longer period of time per application. Many outdoor clothing manufacturers are producing long sleeve fishing shirts with a special fabric coating that provides enhanced UV protection. Also, one company that is well known for producing do-it-yourself clothing dyes, also offers a product that allows you to treat your own clothes with a sun protectant that's washed in while doing the laundry. They claim that treatments last through 20 future washings. We all know that quality sunglasses are essential. Always make sure that the pair you choose to wear while on the water will block 100% of the sun's UV rays. Quality sunglasses don't always have to be expensive.



So this is the time of year to start taking extra precautions. Remember that sun exposure while on the water is more intense than while on land. When you are on the water, not only are you vulnerable to the sun's rays from above, but again as they reflect off the water's surface. So I urge you to take the extra safeguards now, and save yourself a lot of grief later

Remember to catch and release, now more than ever.....

Sugar Land Tree Inspections

Sugar Land inspectors are currently inspecting trees along City right-of-ways to ensure compliance with codes and safe access for fire trucks, ambulances and garbage trucks. Almost half the City has been inspected, and completion of the project is expected by September. Violations result in notices to residents to correct trees that create hazards along public streets. Sugar Land residents and business owners are required by City ordinance to trim their trees if public rights-of-way are affected. Properly pruned trees allow large vehicles such as fire trucks, ambulances and garbage trucks to safely navigate City streets with a clear view of traffic. All trees and limbs growing in or near a rightof-way must be trimmed to the regulated height stated by city ordinance: Where the tree overhangs a residential street, there must be a clear space under the tree that is 12 feet above the street surface and 8 feet above the sidewalk surface. Where the tree overhangs a non-residential street with occasional semi-trailer traffic, there must be a clear space under the tree that is 14 feet above the street surface and 8 feet above the sidewalk surface. Courtesy notices are issued to properties found in violation of the ordinance. Staff works with homeowner associations or property management groups to ensure compliance. If violations persist, the Code Enforcement Department will issue notices of violation. Final notices will provide another compliance deadline. Citations to appear in court will be issued for properties that fail to meet compliance deadlines. City To Test Hurricane Readiness

The City of Sugar Land and the Texas State Guard will hold a full-scale hurricane exercise May 30 through June 1. Areas of focus will include mass sheltering, evacuation and hazmat response.

Exercise participants will work through scenarios that focus on the following objectives:

- Resource Coordination: determine strengths and weaknesses in the current plan governing on-scene command and control, emergency operations center operations and coordination of response resources.
- Access Control: review plans for area perimeter control, staging and incident command post security.
- Sheltering and Housing of Pets: ensure the safety of people and animals.
- Hazmat Response: Identify and contain chemical release and ensure the safety of surrounding communities.

The Texas State Guard will provide the necessary manpower to create a realistic shelter operation at Wheeler Fieldhouse in Mercer Stadium. 16403 Lexington Boulevard. Partners supporting the exercise include Fort Bend ISD, City of Stafford Emergency Management, Fort Bend County Red Cross and Brazos River Authority. The exercise will result in a large presence of military personnel and equipment, as well as radio traffic simulating a disaster response. The purpose of the exercise is to provide participants with an opportunity to evaluate current response concepts, plans and capabilities. For more details, visit: www.sugarlandtx.gov.

The City of Sugar Land's Fourth of July celebration is scheduled for Friday, July 4, from 7-10 p.m., at Constellation Field, 1 Stadium Drive. The Star Spangled Spectacular at Constellation Field will include traditional patriotic entertainment along the concourse and on the field. Participants may bring blankets to spread out in the outfield and enjoy a variety of free entertainment and the fireworks finale after sunset. Due to the stadium's fire code capacity, free tickets are required to enter the event. A maximum of six tickets per household are currently available to Sugar Land residents through Saturday, June 22. Tickets are available at the Imperial Park Recreation Center, 234 Matlage Way. A driver's license is required to establish proof of residency. Any remaining tickets will be made available to the general public beginning June 23. Tickets will be limited to six per address. Requests for more than six tickets will be placed on a waiting list. Constellation Field provides adequate parking, restroom facilities, multiple entry points and other advantages. Sponsorship opportunities are still available for businesses interested in being a part of the event and showcasing their brand to the residents of Sugar Land. 


