SAFETY & WELFARE Credit Card Scam

This latest scam especially targets owners of newer "chip" cards. The FTC is warning that con artists are impersonating card issuers and sending emails requesting personal and financial information, or asking that you click on a malwarelaced link before being issued a new card. The fraudsters are sending emails — purporting to be from companies such as American Express — that convincingly use the company's logo and color scheme, and even have footer links such as "View Our Privacy Policy" and "Contact Us."

No credit card company will email or call you to verify personal info it already has on (At most, you'll get a letter in the mail saying it will arrive soon.) If you're ever unsure, simply call the number on the back of your card (not the one supplied by the email) and ask the company if it's trying to contact you.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS CLASSES

Are you ready for Sonoma County's next disaster? Learn what you need in your emergency kit, create a solid evacuation plan and establish your sources of information and community support system by attending classes at your local library. The Sonoma County Library is hosting the **Emergency Preparedness:**

Sonoma Ready Series to spread the message of emergency preparedness to members of the community. The series is a collaboration with the Sonoma County Department of Emergency Management and Listos (a grass-roots disaster preparedness program) and will be held at our local Sonoma Valley Regional Library & at other branches, giving residents the chance to learn what to do to be sure they can stay safe and keep their families safe during the nextpower outage, fire, earthquake or whatever comes our way. Each branch will host three separate classes on topics relating to emergency preparedness:

- * Emergency Kits and Go Bags
- * Emergency Planning for families & pets... and
- * Sources of Information and Community Support. Sonoma Ready Series events are free and open to all. The series is made possible by the Measure Y sales tax, the community's investment in free public libraries.

REMINDER TO OBTAIN ACC **APPROVAL**

Exterior changes to homes, windows, fences, garage doors, paint colors, gates or roofs must be approved by the **Architectural Control Committee** (ACC) BEFORE work begins. Request forms are available in the clubhouse, online at Chantarelle.org, from ACC committee members and from Strong Management. Completed forms must be submitted to the ACC at least 30 days before the start of the project to allow time for review and follow-up. When projects involve common area fences shared by both the homeowner and the HOA, additional procedures mentioned in the March 2012 "Report on Common Area Fences" must be interested, call Ron Yamato at followed, including obtaining multiple bids. An additional item has been added to the ACC approval process regarding the display of flags. The American Stars and Stripes, individual state flags, and seasonal/ holiday flags may in most cases be flown without permission. Permission to fly other flags must be requested from the ACC. Adhering to ACC rules will ensure the continued coherence and beauty of the Chantarelle community, while at MANAGEMENT COMPANY the same time maintaining the quality of life and desirability of residing here.
