You have all seen these people hard at work cleaning the streets, fixing the signage at the entrance way, cleaning and repairing fences, cleaning the bridge and repairing the bridge lights, decorating for different holidays, keeping the shuffle board court and the pickle ball court in working order, washing the pool deck and chairs, painting and touch up in clubhouse, electrical, plumbing and so much more! There are even residents who have fixed the big coffee pot and the bingo board for us when they have gone on the fritz!

Then there are the major projects like digging out our section of Zephyr Creek that Harry and his crew took care of when the banks had eroded in, rebuilding and replanting the banks; and doing it without heavy machinery too! Or how about the recent project that Marty and some of the guys are tackling in replacing all the old single pane windows on the clubhouse addition with new double pane windows. The old windows were rotted around the sills so the guys have had to rebuild all the window frames so far, not a simple replacement job! Herb had a crew in at the beginning of the year and completely stripped and refinished the clubhouse floors! And the work is not limited to the menfolk, this year an group of women led by Ann Parks tore the office completely apart and repainted and had the furniture rearranged.

New Game Play at Oaks Royal 3 to Benefit Local Charities.

On Monday March 22nd, residents filed into the clubhouse for the 6pm start of a fun new game initiated by Clarence and Cathy Herman that we have dubbed "Beef Bingo". Although a little unsure at first, we soon got into the spirit of this new game. You could hear joyous cries of "Beef" or "Beefo" resounding throughout the clubhouse as residents won games and were awarded tokens for their prizes. Competition was fierce, with much angst in gas people were waiting for just that one special card to be called, and sometimes it even was!

There were 32 frozen 1/2 lb. beef burgers awarded that evening as prizes. Clarence and Cathy said they raised \$72 to benefit the Thomas Promise Foundation, Inc. Dale Shiner said he was trying to get a Foundation representative to come play with us this at our next game.


Next Game: Monday March 29 at 6:00 pm. There is a sign up list in the clubhouse. Everyone is welcome.

Briefly, game play is similar to bingo but instead of calling numbers, the caller calls random cards from a deck of cards.

- Each player has a game board with three slots corresponding to different playing cards. Game board cost \$5.00 each, you may purchase more than one. Like bingo your game boards will be played for the entire game.
- Players cover a slot each time the caller announces a playing card that matches on on their game board. Bring your own tokens to cover the slots on your game board(s). Bingo chips, coins or other small objects will all do.
- The player that covers the three slots on their game board first calls "BEEF" and wins the hand! The prize is one frozen prime beef patty. (Multiple players may win a hand)
- There are four (4) hands of play per round. There are six (6) rounds of play per game.
- The caller uses a new deck of cards for each hand of play, and cards are shuffled before each new round of play begins. Players may exchange cards before a new round of play begins.
- The final round of play, round six (6), is the Bonus Round. Prizes in hand one and two are doubled to two (2) patties, prizes in hands three and four are quadrupled to four (4) patties! (If multiple players win, winners will either split prize or draw for it) In Addition, players may purchase additional cards for the bonus round only at \$1 each.
- Winners will be verified by designated person and given an award token during game. Tokens will be turned in at end of game for frozen beef patties.
- All proceeds, minus cost of prizes, will be used to benefit a non profit charity announced at each game. Tonight's game will
