

From the Pastor's Pen

WHAT'S A "SYNOD"?

We talk about our synod often, but often the assumption is that the "synod" means a small

group of officials who run the church.

Actually, the word "synod" comes from a Greek word that means "to travel a common road - to walk together." The Northeastern PA Synod (NEPS) is comprised of 249 congregations. There is a professional staff, comprised of the Bishop, 2 Assistants to the Bishop who are ordained clergy, an ordained Director of Evangelical Mission, 9 part-time staff including 6 Associates of the Bishop, a Director of Operations, a Director of Communications and Events, a Director of Congregational Legacy & Purpose, and 3 office support staff. Our synod is governed by a council, made up of both ordained and non-ordained individuals, elected at the annual synod assembly. There are representative from each of the 9 Mission Districts of our synod, and "members-at-large" who include representatives from around our synod and some specifically selected to represent the youth of our synod and ethnic communities whose primary language is not English. The synod is NOT "them." The synod is US! We are one of 65 regional synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We have a variety of ministry teams, including Connection Building, Leadership Development, Racial Justice, Witness and Service (which includes the Hunger team and the Green Team) Worship Ministry and Youth and Young Adult. The members and leaders of these teams and the Synod council are congregational members like YOU, who have a passion for a particular ministry. If you'd like to be part of one of these ministry teams, extra hands are always welcomed. Check out the NEPS website for more information: https://nepasynod.org/ Choose from the drop down menu at the top to explore the area that interests you.

Our synod staff, supported by our mission support dollars, guides candidates for rostered, professional ministry through the process and helps each candidate with their discernment process. They provide detailed guidance for congregations when they are seeking professional leaders, especially when calling a pastor. They serve as representatives of our brothers and sisters in Christ at special congregational celebrations, they provide guidance and support when congregations are facing challenges or conflicts and...the list goes on and on.

We are one of 7 ELCA synods in the state of Pennsylvania, and St. Paul's is part of the Schuylkill Mission District.

Along with our sister congregations we help to support the

Along with our sister congregations we help to support the work of Lutheran Social Services, our Lutheran seminary and colleges and many other regional and national ministries. Our synod connections also provide us with access to information and resources for a wide range of topics.

On the website you can learn LOTS more and can sign up to receive the weekly e-newsletter to keep up with what's happening in OUR synod! On the home page, click on "Subscribe" in the upper right corner and choose the e-mailings you would like to receive.

WE are the synod, each of us one of the 119,000 congregational members who make ministry happen in Northeastern Pennsylvania, and who contribute to the ministry of the ELCA here in the U.S. and around the world.

At 3:00 p.m., a pageant "Fourth of July Is A Birthday" by the young people of the congregation was presented in the Fellowship Hall. The celebration on Sunday, July 18th began at 9:00 a.m. with an old time Sunday School program, with part of the program presented by Clara Fessler. At the 10:30 a.m. church service, The Rev. Bulington Latshaw III, son of our minister and wife, was the guest speaker. Worshippers attended in colonial attire. Two guards, Jay and Dwayne Bressler, were at the main entrance of the church with muskets on watch for Indians. At noon, a covered dish luncheon was served in the grove. A Bicentennial Parade began at 2:30 p.m. at the George Reber farm and proceeded west to the church. Spectators enjoyed watching members in colonial dress, with some riding in golf carts, in wagons and carts pulled by horses, on horseback, bicycles and walking. There was a judges' stand to judge the parade entries and the men's beards. At 4:00 p.m., a special worship service was held, and The Rev. Craig Dorward, son-in-law of The Rev. Clarence and Mabel Steigerwalt, was the guest speaker. Old hymns were sung, and there was a rolling of drums and presentation of flags. What a joyous and memorable weekend for the people of St. Paul's and the community in praising God for our wonderful country.
