Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.


Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

Me, A Manager?

One of my grandnephews recently asked me why a country couldn't just go ahead and print more money if their economy



was dipping too low. I never took economics (so we call it back home) as a subject and so I lacked the technical words and the expertise to explain this financial/monetary principle to him. So I very simply tried to explain it to him. He seemed satisfied with my little effort. Next, he went into what would happen if

the earth were to get closer to the sun or further away from the sun. That one I knew the answer to very well. Another financial or economical word I've never really bothered to understand in depth is trust. As I reflected on the gospel of today (Luke 16: 1-13), it kept coming back to me. So, I searched the Merriam-Webster dictionary and it gave me a rich explanation - in layman's terms:

"an arrangement in which someone's property or money is legally held or managed by someone else or by an organization (such as a bank) for usually a set period of time."

This has all the details I thought would be found in a very solid explanation.

- --Ît's an arrangement
- --Someone else's money or property is involved.
- --Held or managed by someone (e.g. bank)
- --For a set period of time

This exemplifies Jesus' message in the gospel in a very beautiful and simple way. In essence, Jesus reminds us today that all we have in this world has been given to us through an arrangement between the owner (God) and each of us. Just as the one managing a trust cannot claim that it belongs to them, neither should any of us ever claim or behave as though what we have belongs to us.

In reality, what we find today is that our language and attitude most often, if not always, shows that we do forget whose properties and things we keep. Note that we only keep them, not have or possess them. We are simply managing them for God. Thus, a time will come when, like the trust manager, we too will sit down with the owner and render an account of how we managed the trust. Note how there's always a set time in the trust arrangement. Similarly, each of us has a set time, even if unknown, when we'd sit down with God and render an account of how we managed the trust.

This should be our overall attitude towards worldly goods financial and otherwise. In addition, we must endeavor to use them in a way that will reap eternal dividends for us.

As we return from summer break and get back into routine activities, I invite you to consider sharing your gifts and talents within Saint Bart's if you're not yet doing so. If you're already doing so, thanks a lot for taking and sharing what God has entrusted you with. Secondly, there is the financial aspect. Jesus' message invites us to consider seriously how we manage and utilize the financial gifts he has given us in trust. Yes, we worked for it and deserve it, but still it's not mine or yours. We're only keeping it – just like banks keep trusts.

May we always be good trustees or managers of our worldly gifts and thus be worthy of greater trust and eternal wealth. Amen.


