Five Sleeper Teams to win it all (20/1 or greater) Last Year's Five Sleeper Teams (Washington, Georgia, Wisconsin, Stanford & Miami) went 55-14 straight up including Georgia who nearly won the National Title at 30/1!

For these sleeper bets, we'll exclude the top six favorites for this year. We must admit though betting on Nick Saban (Alabama 7/4) or Urban Meyer (Ohio State 8/1) at this point is never a bad investment. The two have combined for 9 titles in the last 15 years and when they don't win, they're usually in the hunt.

1. Oklahoma (25/1 at William Hill)

The Sooners have won three straight Big 12 Titles and have made the CFB Playoffs in two of the last three seasons. While Oklahoma has to replace Heisman Trophy winner Baker Mayfield at QB, his replacement Kyler Murray already has starting experience from his days at Texas A&M. The Sooners also return break-out star Rodney Alexander at RB. The schedule could see the Sooners favored in all 12 games this season. Their four toughest games come at Iowa State, vs Texas (in Dallas), at TCU and at West Virginia in the regular season finale. Getting a "blue blood" program that will likely be favored in all 12 games is quite enticing and that's why we made one of our biggest futures bets on the Sooners at 25/1.

2. Washington (40/1 at CG Technology)

The Huskies are one of the most experienced teams in the country with 17 returning starters and have a great 1-2 combo in QB Jake Browning and RB Myles Gaskin who are both 3-year starters already. Washington signed their best recruiting class in the Chris Petersen era and the schedule is manageable as the Huskies are likely to be favored in 11 games this year. The opener vs Auburn (in Atlanta) will see the Huskies as likely FG underdogs and in Pac-12 play, the toughest games will be road trips to Utah, Oregon and a home game vs Stanford. We have an elite coach, a Top 10 team in terms of experience that should be a clear favorite in the Pac-12.

3. Miami, FL (40/1 at West Gate)

Miami started last season 10-0 and were ranked No. 2 in the polls, but would go on to lose their last three games of the season. However, the Hurricanes were playing without three of their top offensive weapons in RB Mark Walton, TE Christopher Herndon and WR Ahmmon Richards down the stretch. This year the Hurricanes welcome back 14 starters and should have one of the best defenses in the country (particularly at LB). The schedule is very manageable as the Canes have two coin flip games, the first in the opener vs LSU (in Arlington, TX) and a road game at Virginia Tech. Otherwise, the Hurricanes will be favored in their other 10 games and likely all by a TD or more.

4. Michigan State (60/1 at West Gate)

Last year the Spartans were coming off a 3-9 season and were one of the least experienced teams in the country. However, head coach Mark Dantonio again worked his magic and Michigan State went 10-3. Now a year later, Michigan State is one of the most experienced teams in the country with 19 returning starters (most of any team with a winning record last season). Michigan State returns their QB Brian Lewerke, RB L.J. Scott and four starting offensive linemen. Michigan State also gets both Ohio State and Michigan at home this year and will be favored in at least 10 games. A year after the Big Ten got shut out of the CFB Playoff, that is unlikely to happen again and the Spartans could be a surprise winner.

5. Wisconsin (30/1 at West Gate)

The Badgers are coming off one of the best seasons in school history and this year the Badgers bring back their starting QB Alex Hornibrook, a Heisman contender at RB in Jonathan Taylor who rushed for an FBS freshman record 1,977 yards and all five starters on the offensive line. The schedule is much more difficult than last year where the Badgers were favored in all 12 regular season games. This year the Badgers will most likely be favored in 10 games with road trips to Michigan (+4) and Penn State (+7) seeing them in the underdog role. Still, the Badgers are the clear-cut favorite in the Big Ten West which likely means they are one win away in the Big Ten Championship game from making the CFB Playoffs.

Long-shots: Florida (100/1 at West Gate)

The Gators made a terrific hire in bringing in former O.C. Dan Mullen who did a great job at Mississippi St and he inherits an experienced team with 19 returning starters. Florida could be favored in at least 8 games this year and should start the season 3-0. They get the other two SEC East dark horses Missouri and South Carolina at home (UF likely favored by a FG in both) which means the Gators are just one upset away over favored Georgia from winning the SEC East for the third time in four seasons.

Arizona (150/1 at William Hill)

The Wildcats are not going to win the National Championship this season. However, the Wildcats are very experienced with 16 returning starters including a Heisman contender at QB in Khalil Tate who averaged 319 total ypg in the final 9 games of the season. I like the Kevin Sumlin hire and remember Sumlin was 11-2 his first season at Texas A&M. Finally, the Pac-12 South is wide open this year and Arizona avoids both Washington and Stanford (two best teams in the Pac-12) while they get to host USC. If they get to the Pac-12 title game, then we can possibly look to hedge this ticket.

1. Alabama (13-1 SU/6-8 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 96.83
Returning Starters: 12 (8 offense, 4 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #7



It should come as no surprise as to which team tops my 2018 early power ratings. The defending National Champions still have the best coach and best roster in all of college football. The Crimson Tide do return only 12 starters and lost WR Calvin Ridley plus all 4 starters in the secondary including safety Minkah Fitzpatrick. The Tide also lost both their O.C. Brian Daboll to the Buffalo Bills and D.C. Jeremy Pruitt to Tennessee. There will be a QB battle between Tua Tagovailoa (title game star) and Jalen Hurts (2-year starter) but the Tide have plenty of talented play-makers in RB's Damien Harris and Najee Harris a long with WR Jerry Jeudy and LB's Dylan Moses and Mack Wilson. Alabama has been favored in 111 of their last 112 games and the Crimson Tide will be favored in all 12 games this year with 10 of those by double-digits. Their two toughest games will be at LSU on November 3rd (likely a TD favorite) and a home game vs Auburn in the finale (likely a 10-point favorite).

2. Clemson (12-2 SU/8-5-1 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 96.22
Returning Starters: 15 (7 offense, 8 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #6



Thanks to the return of 15 starters from last year's ACC Championship season, the Tigers enter 2018 as heavy favorites to win the ACC again and make their 4th straight appearance in the college football playoff. Several underclassmen decided against leaving early for the NFL Draft giving Clemson the best defensive line in college football. Their four returning starters on the DL (Austin Bryant, Clelin Ferrell, Dexter Lawrence and Christian Wilkins) have a combined 535 career tackles, 89.5 tackles for loss and 47 sacks! Kelly Bryant returns at QB but will be pushed by incoming frosh Trevor Lawrence and sophomore Hunter Johnson. Clemson will be favored in all 12 games this year with their two toughest games coming at Texas A&M (Clemson likely a 10-point favorite) and at Florida State where Clemson will likely be a near TD favorite.

3. Ohio State (12-2 SU/7-7 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 95.71
Returning Starters: 12 (7 offense, 5 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #2



The defending Big Ten Champs closed 2017 strong with five straight victories highlighted by a 17-point win over Pac-12 champ USC in the Cotton Bowl. While the Buckeyes lose 4-year starting QB J.T. Barrett, his likely replacement Dwayne Haskins has more upside and both RB's J.K. Dobbins and Mike Weber return. Head coach Urban Meyer signed another top-notch recruiting class and also made a great hire in bringing in former Washington State D.C Alex Grinch to co-coordinate the defense with Greg Schiano. The Buckeyes will likely be favored in at least 10 games this year, however road trips to Penn State and Michigan State (a pair of Top 15 teams) will likely decide who comes out of the rugged Big Ten East Division. The Buckeyes will likely be around a FG favorite at Michigan State but could find themselves a very small underdog in Happy Valley.

4. Georgia (13-2 SU/11-4 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 94.56
Returning Starters: 12 (7 offense, 5 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #1



The Bulldogs came up just short in the National Title game but 2017 was no "one-year wonder" for Georgia who welcomes back 12 starters and signed the No. 1 recruiting class in the country. The Bulldogs do have several holes to fill including trying to replace two of the Top 5 RB's in school history in Sony Michel and Nick Chubb a long with rebuilding a LB corps that lost Butkus Award winner Roquan Smith. However, QB Jake Fromm returns after a great freshman season as do four starters on the offensive line. RB D'Andre Swift showed some flashes in limited duty last season. The schedule is also very manageable as the Bulldogs will likely be favored in all 12 games with a road trip to LSU (UGA around a FG favorite) being their toughest game a long with a home game vs Auburn (UGA likely a TD favorite).

5. Auburn (10-4 SU/6-8 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 91.92
Returning Starters: 11 (6 offense, 5 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #12



The Tigers had a very disappointing finish to the 2017 season losing the SEC Championship game by three touchdowns to Georgia and Auburn was upset as a 10-point favorite in the Peach Bowl to UCF. Still Auburn exceeded preseason expectations by beating both Alabama and Georgia in the regular season. QB Jarrett Stidham returns along with most of his top receivers as the Tigers should have a better passing attack. The Tigers do have to replace RB Kerryon Johnson (1,391 yards and 18 TD's) but keep an eye on Baylor transfer Kam Martin and the defense has been one of the best in the SEC under D.C. Kevin Steele. However, the schedule is brutal with road trips to Alabama (likely 10-point underdog) and Georgia (likely TD underdog). Games against Washington (in Atlanta) and at Mississippi State will likely see Auburn as a very short favorite. Overall, this is an Auburn team that is likely Top 5 on paper but could finish the season with three losses.

6. Washington (10-3 SU/7-6 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 91.83
Returning Starters: 17 (8 offense, 9 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #13



After notching back-to-back seasons with at least 10 wins, the Huskies are the most experienced of all the Top 10 teams with 17 returning starters. The Huskies have a great 1-2 combo in QB Jake Browning and RB Myles Gaskin who are both 3-year starters already. Washington also brings back several players who were lost for the 2017 season because of injury including LT Trey Adams and WR Chico McClatcher. They do lose their best WR in Dante Pettis and the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in DT Vita Vea but Washington signed their best recruiting class in the Chris Petersen era. The schedule is manageable as the Huskies are likely to be favored in 11 games this year. The opener vs Auburn (in Atlanta) will see the Huskies as likely FG underdogs and in Pac-12 play, the toughest games will be road trips to Utah, Oregon and a home game vs Stanford. However, the Huskies are likely to be TD favorites in all three.

7. Oklahoma (12-2 SU/8-6 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 91.64
Returning Starters: 13 (7 offense, 6 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #9



The Sooners came up just short in the Rose Bowl to Georgia, but still it was a very successful first season for head coach Lincoln Riley as Oklahoma won their third straight Big 12 title and made the college football playoff for the second time in three seasons. While Oklahoma has to replace Heisman Trophy winner Baker Mayfield at QB, his replacement Tyler Murray already has starting experience from his days at Texas A&M. Murray was also one of the top-rated players coming out of high school. The Sooners do lose TE Mark Andrews and OT Orlando Brown but break-out star Rodney Alexander returns at RB. The defense will have to improve despite losing some of its best players including DE/LB Ogbonnia Okoronkwo. The schedule could see the Sooners favored in all 12 games this season. Their four toughest games come at Iowa State, vs Texas (in Dallas), at TCU and at West Virginia in the regular season finale.

8. Penn State (11-2 SU/8-5 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 91.24
Returning Starters: 10 (7 offense, 3 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #5



It's remarkable to think that in the middle of 2016, head coach James Franklin was on the hot seat. However, the Nittany Lions are now 20-3 SU/18-5 ATS in their last 23 games highlighted by a Fiesta Bowl win over Washington last year. Franklin will have his work cut out for him this year as Penn State returns only 10 starters and loses arguably the most talented player in college football in RB Saquon Barkley. Penn State also lost a gifted offensive play-caller in Joe Moorhead to Mississippi State but QB Trace McSorley returns and Penn State signed one of the best recruiting classes in school history. While Penn State could be favored in 10 of their 12 games this season, life in the Big Ten East division will not be easy including home games vs Ohio State (likely pick-em), Michigan State (likely TD favorites) with a road trip to Michigan being the Nittany Lions toughest test of the season (likely FG dogs).

9. Wisconsin (13-1 SU/9-5 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 89.74
Returning Starters: 14 (9 offense, 5 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #44



The Badgers are coming off one of the best seasons in school history as they won a school-record 13 games highlighted by an Orange Bowl win at Miami, FL. This year the Badgers bring back their starting QB Alex Hornibrook, a Heisman contender at RB in Jonathan Taylor who rushed for an FBS freshman record 1,977 yards and all five starters on the offensive line. There are more question marks on the defense especially in the secondary where the Badgers lose three starters. The schedule is much more difficult than last year where the Badgers were favored in all 12 regular season games. This year the Badgers will most likely be favored in 10 games with road trips to Michigan (+4) and Penn State (+7) seeing them in the underdog role.

10. Notre Dame (10-3 SU/8-5 ATS in 2017)
Pre-Spring Power Rating: 89.05
Returning Starters: 15 (6 offense, 9 defense)
2018 Recruiting Class Rank: #10



Last year the Fighting Irish bounced back from a disastrous 4-8 season to win 10 games for the 2nd time in three seasons. While Notre Dame loses their leading rusher (Josh Adams), leading receiver (Equanimeous St. Brown) and a pair of likely first round NFL draft choices on the OL in OT Mike McGlinchey and OG Quenton Nelson, the Irish are still very experienced with 15 returning starters. QB Brandon Wimbush (30 total TD's) returns and the Irish have one of the most experienced defenses in the country. The schedule is still pretty difficult starting with a home game vs Michigan (around a FG favorite) in the opener. The Irish also have home games vs Stanford and Florida State along with road trips to Virginia Tech and USC. Still Notre Dame could be favored in as many as 10 games this year.

Ranking and Grading the New College Head Coaching Hires of 2018

With signing day now a six weeks old and most coaching staffs now fully complete, it's time to rank the new head coaching hires for the upcoming season.

I evaluated prior head coaching experience, familiarity with the school and surrounding recruiting area while also taking into consideration the state of the program and realistically, who they could have hired in their current state of affairs.



1. **Jimbo Fisher, Texas A&M.** The Aggies certainly paid a premium to get their guy but Fisher is just one of four active coaches that has won a National Title. He was 83-23 at Florida State in eight seasons and hired a great staff led by D.C Mike Elko (Notre Dame). Fisher also signed a Top 20 recruiting class. **Grade: A**
2. **Dan Mullen, Florida.** Mullen checks all the boxes for a great hire. He has prior head coaching experience in the SEC (69-46 in 9 years at Mississippi St). He has former ties to the school (was the O.C. at Florida under Urban Meyer), signed a Top 15 recruiting class and surrounded himself with a solid staff. **Grade: A**
3. **Chip Kelly, UCLA.** Kelly was a massive success at Oregon going 46-7 in four years then was 28-35 in 4 years at the NFL (PHI/SF). Kelly knows the West coast, signed a Top 20 recruiting class and also made some solid hires. **Grade: A**
4. **Scott Frost, Nebraska.** The Cornhuskers zeroed in on Frost from the start and why not considering he was a former National Title winning QB here in 1997. Frost inherited a UCF program that went just 0-12 in 2015 and by year two had the Knights 13-0 and ranked in the Top 10 after a Peach Bowl win. **Grade: A**
5. **Willie Taggart, Florida State.** Taggart is just 47-50 in 9 years as a head coach but he inherited a losing team at WKU, USF and Oregon and turned around all 3 programs. Taggart is familiar with the Florida area (grew up in Bradenton) and signed the best class (No. 11) out of all the new head coaches. **Grade: B+**
6. **Kevin Sumlin, Arizona.** Sumlin was 86-43 in 10 years at Houston and Texas A&M leading his team to 9 bowl games. While he was let go at Texas A&M, he still had the 2nd best win % out of any A&M head coach since 1950. **Grade: B+**
7. **Joe Moorhead, Mississippi State.** Moorhead was 38-13 in four years at Fordham making the FCS playoffs three times. He then oversaw one of the most improved and best offenses in CFB the last two years at Penn State as O.C. **Grade: B+**
8. **Steve Campbell, South Alabama.** Campbell has a ton of head coaching experience. He went 27-8 at Division II Delta St with a National Title. He was 87-22 in 10 years at Miss Gulf Coast (JUCO) including a title and then went 33-15 at Central Arkansas the last four years leading them to the playoffs twice. **Grade: B+**
9. **Chad Morris, Arkansas.** Morris was an ultra-successful high school coach in Texas (169-38) before becoming a hot-shot O.C. at Tulsa and Clemson. He inherited a bad SMU team and led them to a bowl by Year 3. Having strong ties to the state of Texas should help the Hogs on the recruiting trail in the future. **Grade: B**
10. **Sonny Dykes, SMU.** While Dykes is only 41-46 in 7 years as a head coach at Louisiana Tech and California, he has long-term ties to the state and schematically it should be an easy transition from the Chad Morris offense. **Grade: B**
11. **Billy Napier, UL-Lafayette.** While Napier has no prior head coaching experience, he is one of the hot young coaches with offensive coordinator experience at two Power 5 programs plus a stint at Alabama under Nick Saban. **Grade: B**
12. **Mario Cristobal, Oregon.** Cristobal was 27-47 at FIU and led them to a pair of bowl games. He served under Nick Saban for four years before being named the O.C. here last year. We felt the Ducks could have done better but Cristobal did keep D.C. Jim Leavitt on staff and signed a Top 20 class. **Grade: B-**
13. **Jeremy Pruitt, Tennessee.** Obviously, the Tennessee coaching search was a dumpster fire but the Vols eventually made a solid hire bringing in the former Alabama D.C. that has led several top-notch D's the last 5 years at Florida St/Georgia/Bama. Pruitt does not have any prior head coaching experience. **Grade: B-**
14. **Jonathan Smith, Oregon State.** Smith was a former QB here on the famous 2000 team that won the Fiesta Bowl and has served as O.C. under Chris Petersen at Washington the last 4 years. Smith also made a wise hire bringing in former Oregon State head coach Mike Riley who can help tutor the 39-year old. **Grade: B-**
15. **Mike Bloomgren, Rice.** With the smallest enrollment, Rice is one of the toughest jobs. While Bloomgren doesn't have any prior head coaching experience, he was a OC at another tough academic school in Stanford. **Grade: B-**
16. **Matt Luke, Ole Miss.** Luke did a solid job as the interim last year getting Ole Miss to 6-6 in a probation year. Luke has long term ties to the program and state and while he isn't a top-notch name, who was Ole Miss going to get? **Grade: C**
17. **Chad Lunsford, Georgia Southern.** Last year Georgia Southern had arguably their worst season in school history but were much better in the second half of the season when Lunsford took over as interim. Lunsford signed the best recruiting class in the Sun Belt but has no prior head coaching experience. **Grade: C**
18. **Josh Heupel, UCF.** The long-time Oklahoma O.C. had a successful stint as the Missouri O.C. the last two years. Still, Heupel has no previous head coaching experience and also has no long-term ties to the state of Florida. **Grade: C**
19. **Sean Lewis, Kent State.** Lewis is just 31 years old and obviously has no head coaching experience. He worked under Dino Babers the last three years as Co-OC and made a splash by signing a very solid recruiting class. **Grade: C**
20. **Dana Dimel, UTEP.** Dimel was successful at Wyoming in the late 90's but had a bad stint as the Houston head coach (just 8-26). He's been a long-time Bill Snyder assistant including being the O.C. there for the last 8 years. **Grade: C**
21. **Herm Edwards, Arizona State.** This is one of the strangest hires in recent college football history. First, the firing of Todd Graham came as a bit of a shock considering the Sun Devils exceeded expectations in 2017. Then Edwards who hasn't coached in college since 1989 and hasn't coached in any capacity since 2008 was hired to be a "CEO" type. Both coordinators left. Not a good sign. **Grade: D-**

Top 5 Most Improved Teams in College Football Entering Spring 2018

Last Year's Top 5 Went from 27-35 in '16 to 48-20 in '17

1. **Florida (4-7 SU/2-7-2 ATS in 2017)**
Returning Starters: 19 (8 offense, 9 defense)
2017 Recruiting Class Rank: #14



Florida won the SEC East in both 2015 and 2016 but last year slumped to just 4-7. This year the Gators made a terrific hire in bringing in former O.C. Dan Mullen and he inherits an experienced team with 19 returning starters. Florida could be favored in at least 8 games this year meaning they could double their win total from a season ago and possibly be a dark horse in the SEC.

2. **Baylor (1-11 SU/5-7 ATS in 2017)**
Returning Starters: 17 (9 offense, 8 defense)
2017 Recruiting Class Rank: #30



After seven straight winning seasons including four years where they won 10 games or more, the Bears really bottomed out in the first year under head coach Matt Rhule at 1-11. However, Baylor's record could have been better as they lost 3 games by a TD or less and showed very well in games vs Oklahoma and West Virginia. This year the Bears return 17 starters, signed a solid recruiting class and the schedule is favorable and they could start the season 4-0. Going from one win to flirting with bowl eligibility certainly qualifies you for most improved.

3. **North Carolina (3-9 SU/5-7 ATS in 2017)**
Returning Starters: 13 (6 offense, 7 defense)
2017 Recruiting Class Rank: #23



North Carolina was very young last year and possibly no team dealt with more injuries than the Tar Heels. After bottoming out in a 59-7 loss to Virginia Tech that put them at 1-7 SU/ATS, the Tar Heels started to show improvement at the end of last season with four straight covers to close the season and a couple of wins. This year the Heels are more experienced and healthier. Excluding a road trip to Miami, we don't have North Carolina listed at more than a TD underdog in any game meaning the Tar Heels could easily double their win total this year.

4. **Georgia Southern (2-10 SU/4-7-1 ATS in 2017)**
Returning Starters: 18 (9 offense, 9 defense)
2017 Recruiting Class Rank: #88



Last year Georgia Southern had arguably their worst season in school history losing 10 games, however they were much better in the second half of the season (2-4 SU/3-2-1 ATS) than the first half (0-6 SU/1-5 ATS). That coincided when now head coach Chad Lunsford took over as interim. This year Georgia Southern is one of the most experienced teams in the country with 18 returning starters and Lunsford also signed the best recruiting class in the Sun Belt. Georgia Southern should easily double their win total this year and could flirt with bowl eligibility.

5. **Nebraska (4-8 SU/4-8 ATS in 2017)**
Returning Starters: 15 (7 offense, 8 defense)
2017 Recruiting Class Rank: #22



Last year the Cornhuskers bottomed out at 4-8 SU/ATS, their worst season in more than 50 years. However, things are looking up this season and it started with the hiring of former Nebraska QB Scott Frost who inherited an 0-12 UCF team and won six games his first season. Frost has an experienced team to work with (15 returning starters) and brings in a solid recruiting class (No. 22). The Huskers would have been higher on this list if not for a tough schedule that sees the Huskers pull Ohio State, Michigan and Michigan State from the Big Ten East. Still, I expect Nebraska to get to bowl eligibility this year.

Honorable Mention (Last year's HM Teams went from 14-23 SU to 29-23 SU):

Michigan (8-5 SU/5-7-1 ATS in 2017)-Last year the Wolverines were one of the least experienced teams in the country but this year Michigan is one of the most experienced teams with 18 returning starters and are probably a TD better than last year's team. The reason Michigan didn't make my Top 5 most improved is a daunting schedule that sees them travel to Notre Dame, Michigan State and Ohio State.

West Virginia (7-6 SU/5-7-1 ATS in 2017)-The Mountaineers stumbled down the stretch last year as they lost QB Will Grier to injury and proceeded to lose their last three games. This year they return 14 starters including Grier and WR David Sills and they could challenge Oklahoma for the Big 12 Title.

Tulsa (2-10 SU/5-7 ATS in 2017)-After a 10-win season in 2016, the Golden Hurricane took several steps back a year ago dropping to just 2-10. However, their record could have been much better as Tulsa was 0-5 in games decided by a TD or less. This year's squad brings back 15 starters and Tulsa should double their win total.

BYU (4-9 SU/4-9 ATS in 2017)-BYU started last season a miserable 1-7 SU/0-8 ATS but finished the season 3-2 SU/4-1 ATS in their last 5 games. This year's team welcomes back 15 starters and could flirt with bowl eligibility.

Ball State (2-10 SU/3-8-1 ATS in 2017)-The Cardinals were decimated by injuries last year and would lose their final 8 games by an average of 36.5 ppg. This year's team welcomes back 19 starters and could double their win total.
