I think each of us should have something that sticks out in our mind, concerning Corvairs. Here are a couple of things that I remember.

Sometime in 1962, my Dad traded a 1957 Ford sedan for a '62 white 4-door Corvair. As best as I can recall, (I was only 2 or 3 at the time) it was not a Monza, but probably a 700 model. The interior was either dark blue or green. Don't know was size engine, but I do remember it was a 3-speed. I used to have the paperwork that was done to complete the sale, but unfortunately, it has been lost. It seems like Dad was given 300.00 for his trade in Ford.

In the early 60's. my Dad was a salesman for Colonial Baking Co. One of his customers was McDonalds, on Rocky Creek road in Macon. Sometimes, they would call, saying that they needed more hamburger buns. So we would have to get in the car (Corvair) and go to the bakery and get buns to take to the restaurant. I have a painful memory of one of those trips. We had the buns in the car, and had arrived at McDonalds. He got out to get the bread out of the trunk, and when he shut his door, my fingers were wrapped around the post between the front and back door. Fortunately, being only 3 years old, my fingers were small, and nothing was broken. But, it still hurt like the devil !

Corvair trivia will return next month, so in the meantime,
