This Sentinel lists changes in 2018 ICD-10-CM that impact record keeping and billing effective this Sunday, tomorrow, 1 Oct 2017.

This is a good time to remind ourselves that, of the American Psychiatric Association's 74 District Branches, the Washington Psychiatric Society has had the greatest impact on the classification of mental disorders, dating back to the 1970s. So, if you have some proposals to improve the next ICD-10-CM, please bring them to our attention. Keep in mind that even if your proposal is very winning, it will take time to find its way into a future edition of ICD-10-CM, even though published annually.

I am asked, "When will we see ICD-11-CM's adoption?" Answer: "Years away."

For those wanting to ink in some of these additions to their copy of DSM 5, I am using the first printing of DSM-5's page numbers. I am not sure that all subsequent printings have the same paging.

The list infra has the names used in ICD-10-CM, not DSM-5's. Names are not a big deal as the codes are what counts, as to payments and data collections.
