DID YOU KNOW

Earth Month takes place in April every year and started in 1970. This annual earth awareness month is an opportunity to educate and advocate for change around the issues most impacting our planet!

In the decades leading up to the first Earth Day, Americans were consuming vast amounts of leaded gas through inefficient automobiles. Industry belched out smoke and smog with little fear of the consequences. Air and water pollution was commonly accepted as the result of prosperity. Mainstream America was largely oblivious to environmental concerns and how a polluted environment threatens human health.

In 1962, Rachel Carson's New York Times bestseller *Silent Spring*, created a watershed moment. Selling more than 500,000 copies in 24 countries as it raised public awareness and concern for living organisms, the environment and the inextricable links between pollution and public health concerns.

Individual groups had been fighting individually against oil spills, polluting factories, raw sewage, toxic dumps, pesticides, freeways smog, the loss of wilderness and the extinction of wildlife.



Earth Day 1970, by Senator Nelson, Wisconson, created a shared vision around these common values, and achieved a rare political alignment, enlisting support from Republicans and Democrats, rich and poor, urban dwellers and farmers, business and labor leaders.

By the end of 1970, the first Earth Day led to the creation of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the passage of other first of their kind environmental laws!

In 1990, Earth Day went global, mobilizing 200 million people in 141 countries and lifting environmental issues onto the world stage and gave a huge boost to recycling efforts worldwide.

Today, Earth Day is widely recognized as the largest secular observance in the world, marked by more than a billion people every year!

DREDGING FOR BEACH SAND TO BEGIN!Harbor Dredging to Occur April – May, 2023

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers plans to begin mobilizing on April 3 for the annual dredge of the Oceanside Harbor inlet. The dredge is expected to begin about April 12.

They plan to wrap up operations by Memorial Day weekend, but there may be times when dredging is paused due to high



waves, grunions, or equipment issues, which can result in delays. This year, they estimate about 500,000 cubic yards of sand will be placed on Oceanside beaches, which is much more than usual.

Please use caution in and around the beach area while the dredging project is underway!
