

The Knight in Shining Armor

To truly appreciate our story, you need to know something of our 22-year-old daughter Tania. All of her life she has been challenged by her cognitive impairment caused by Fragile X Syndrome. However, as a young adolescent, her life became more complicated as she began to exhibit severe social anxiety. Tania's social anxiety is an invisible barrier that prevents her from interacting with the people who love her and want to support her. It is an obstacle that prevents her from enjoying the company and enjoyment of family gatherings. A major goal of Tania's Person Centered Plan is to develop her social skills so she can engage in vocational training. So, for over the past year and a half, she's worked twice a week as a volunteer at the Pontiac Lighthouse filling orders in the food pantry. We haven't noticed any significant improvement in Tania overcoming her social anxiety until this summer when we went to the Michigan Renaissance Festival...

It was on a warm and sunny September Saturday morning when we drove out for an adventure to Holly, Michigan. We were excited with the anticipation of knowing we'd be spending the day at the festival, enjoying comical stage shows, shopping at the artisans' stores, and experiencing the fantasy of a recreated time from the 16th century. Tania has attended this annual event her whole life. She can leave the trappings of her regular life behind and "Live the Legend" of the Renaissance Festival at Holly Grove. Our family has created many wonderful memories at this venue but none as special as what we experienced this year.

We knew it was going to be a great day when we ran into our friend Grey Beard. He normally attends the festival costumed as an authentic Caribbean pirate but surprised us by showing up this year as a Scottish Highlander. Tania always looks for Grey Beard at the festival but she hadn't seen him for over three years. We crossed his path shortly after we arrived at the festival.

Tania and Grey Beard were equally surprised to see each other again. Grev Beard asked Tania about what she'd been up to lately and remarked at how she'd grown into such a fair young lady. This compliment left Tania beaming with a smile and she was relaxed enough with Grey Beard to allow him to tell her a few jokes. Laughing has a calming effect on Tania, and as she continued to laugh at his jokes, she became comfortable enough to pose for a picture with him. She even told Grey Beard of how she's been volunteering at the food pantry and how she was here to watch the Knights joust. We recognized this extroverted behavior as unusual for her and took it as a good omen as our day at the festival was just starting.

Tania had made the comment to Grey Beard that she wanted to see the Knights' Joust, an event she normally shies away from because of the large crowd and loud cheering. After she confirmed it was something that she genuinely wanted to do, we made our way off the North King's Boulevard, through the Queen's Walk, and over to the Upton Downs Joust Field. We got there just in time to find a row of hay bales with enough space us to sit and have a good view of the field.


As we listened to the Mayor of Holly Grove explain the Joust, we learned the competition would take place between four Knights, each positioned at one corner of the field. The spectators at the adjacent corners would cheer for their respective Knight. At our corner of the field was Sir Tyler, the youngest and most inexperienced of the four. Sir Tyler explained to us that it would help his confidence if we were to cheer for him loudly, so we obliged.

The first event of the Joust was a competition of skill with the lance. Each Knight would ride the length of the field and try to skewer multiple

rings: the Knight with the most rings upon his lance would be declared the winner. It was at this time that Sir Tyler called upon his audience for a "fair young maiden" who he would champion on the field of honor. To our wonder and surprise, Tania volunteered along with two dozen other women, her hand raised up high and waving for attention. After a moment of perusing the audience, Sir Tyler pointed to Tania and signaled that she could come down to him and receive a token of his admiration. When the Mayor came over and asked for the young maiden's name, she excitedly answered "Tania" into the microphone. Our jaws dropped as we watched our daughter step out in front of over 500 people, speak her name into the PA system, and allow herself to be the center of focus, as Sir Tyler gave her a silk rose as a tribute. Once that part of the ceremony was complete, the competition formally under way. During the joust, we cheered for Sir Tyler like he was truly our daughter's champion. When the joust was over, the Knights dismounted and allowed the audience a chance to pet their horses or ask questions. Tania once again surprised us by going down to the fence rail to speak with Sir Tyler and pose with him for a picture. Even though Sir Tyler didn't win the joust, he still came out a winner with us and with Tania.

It may be the fantasy atmosphere of the festival that allowed Tania to break through the barrier of her social anxiety, but we're still seeing positive effects weeks later. Tania has been demonstrating marked improvement in using her social skills at Lighthouse. She has begun to regularly call out the food orders, call out the recipient's name, and verify with them the order is correct. We're glad to say that Tania's weekend festival fantasy has had a lasting, positive effect on her daily reality.

And the tale continues.






