



A Brief Look At Some Summer Hill History By Harry Schwenk

During World War II, Pastor Steigerwalt and our church members, kept in contact with the church members who were serving our country. From what I have been reading, Christmas packages were sent to them. Two publications known as "The Assistant Pastor" and "The Messenger" were also sent to them. Following are some notes which the church received from our service people, and they were published and sent out to our members here at home.

From:

Pvt. Arlan Boyer, Camp Blanding, FL-Many thanks for the Christmas box from the Church. We were out on field maneuvers, a 25-mile hike from Camp and the box was certainly appreciated out there. I am enclosing two dollars for the Church. Thanks so much, Arlan. (Arlan never made it back home. He was killed in battle in Europe, and was the only child of Charles and Amy Boyer. He was confirmed at St. Paul's in 1937.)

Cpl. Lewis Boyer, Southwest Pacific-A few of us took a six-mile hike to a Mission (native) Church. We were greeted by the natives, who gave us coconuts and tropical fruits. The natives may be only partly civilized, but they believe in God. On Sunday, the Church is used for worship and during the week it is used as a school to teach the youth how to read and write. Americans are very much loved by the natives. Some speak English very well. They sang some English hymns. (Lewis was the son of Clinton and Ellen Boyer and was a life-long member of St. Paul's. He was confirmed at St. Paul's in 1937.)

Darwin Dewald, S1/c., Oceanside, California-I received the Christmas box from the Church. Please express my appreciation to the congregation. Thanks a million. It really was swell. I am training here in a Joint Assault Signal Company to communicate with the troops and the ships on land. We are among the first to go ashore. (Darwin was the son of Calvin and Cora Dewald. He was confirmed at St. Paul's in 1943.)

Pfc. Willard Dreisbach, c/o P. M., N. Y.-I want to thank you and all the members for the nice Christmas box I received. Also, for all that you are doing for the service men. I know it is a lot of work and we do appreciate it. (Willard was the son of Mahlon and Vallie Dreisbach. He was confirmed at St. Paul's in 1935.)

Sgt. Russell Fidler, Italy- I sure was surprised to read in the Assistant Pastor about Ernest Krammes and the places he was at. I was between Naples and Vesuvius about the same time. It would have been great to see him. I sure appreciate the Messenger and Assistant Pastor. (Rusell parents were Clinton and Annie Fidler. Presently, at the age of 101, Russell is the oldest member of our congregation and has been a life-long member. He was confirmed at St. Paul's in 1937.)

Pfc. Lewis Fidler, France-Many of the people here in France where we are, have lost their homes and are very poor. I spend most of my time in a fox hole, even sleep there. Last Sunday we had our church service under a large pine tree. (Lewis was the son of Jeremiah and Ellen Fidler, and also a cousin of Russell. He was confirmed at St. Paul's in 1941)

Young Adult in Global Mission: A Year in Senegal

Asalaa maalekum. May God's peace be upon you.

My name is Quentin Bernhard. I recently served with the ELCA program Young Adults in Global Mission—YAGM—in Senegal. My time with YAGM came to an end in July, and Senegal country cohort peers and I returned to the United States. We are among the 23 young adults from the 2022-2023 year who served in accompaniment in four different country programs.

I live in New Tripoli in Lehigh County, and I'm a member of New Life Lutheran Church in New Tripoli. Many individuals and congregations from our synod supported me in my YAGM year. Thank you for your support of my time in Senegal and for the opportunity to be in continuing relationship after my time abroad.


My coming to the United States, to the communities I grew up in in Pennsylvania, was also my leaving a community I grew in—a community I grew in as a Lutheran and as a young person, one I have good friends in. I lived in Yeumbeul Bene Baraque, in western Senegal, for ten months. I lived with a host family in a community. I saw friends every day, many when at my placement site. Connected with our partner organization Senegalese Lutheran Development Services—SLDS—I worked in a community center that serves the community in numerous ways, splitting my time between the library and the mutual fund credit union.

My friends and family in Senegal continue to send me voice messages, reminding me that I am also Maguette Ndiaye, my Senegalese name, and reminding me that we are still connected, even if connected in a different way now. Our relationships and our future—all of our future—is unknown to us. Our faith—and our trust in one another—can allow us to take steps and leaps in that future.
