

#### LAKESHARK PREPARED AND TESTED RECIPES

#### FIREBALL WHISKEY CANDIED BACON BY LINDA BRESLICH

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 pound thick cut bacon 3/4 cup brown sugar 1/4 cup Fireball Whiskey 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon Optional: 1/2 tsp ground red pepper for spice

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Cut the thick cut bacon into thirds and place in a bowl.

Add the brown sugar, Fireball, cinnamon, and ground red pepper (if using.) Toss until evenly coated.

Place the bacon pieces on a wire baking rack over a lined baking sheet. Place in a 350 degree oven for 30-40 minutes.

Cook time will depend on how thick the bacon is cut.

Carefully transfer to a plate while still warm (to prevent sticking) and let cool. The bacon will harden as it comes to room temp.

#### GRILLED FIREBALL PINEAPPLE BY CLAY WAGNAAR

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 750 ML bottle Fireball whiskey
1 pineapple
1 cup turbinado sugar
1 cup brown sugar
1 tablespoon cinnamon

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Cut pineapple into chunks. Soak overnight in Fireball.

Combine turbinado and brown sugar with cinnamon.

Drain pineapple. Save Fireball-juice mix to use in baked beans or for game glaze.

Roll pineapple chunks in sugar mixture. Place chunks in grilling basket or on skewers that have been soaked in water.

Preheat grill to medium high. Grill pineapple, turning occasionally, until a paring knife goes easily into the center of a piece, 8-10 minutes.
