Lord. Something happened.




St. Paul's will be hosting a pot luck supper on March 29, 2018, Maundy Thursday at 6:00 PM.

Bishop Fisher is encouraging every Parish in the Diocese to pray and discern ways that we all can be more intentional about sharing our faith stories with each other and with those in our community that are seeking a way to a loving relationship with God.

The 2018 Evangelism Initiative will culminate on the Weekend of October 20/21 with Presiding Bishop Michael Curry officiating at three events spread across the Diocese from the Berkshires to Holyoke to Worcester. The Diocese of Western MA was one of only two dioceses in the Country that the Presiding Bishop will come to this year to focus on the issue of Evangelism.

CAN YOU SPARE A PAIR?


175 pairs of socks have been donated SO FAR!


Distribution will be on Sat, 8/11. The backpacks are given to children from preschool through high school and filled with grade level supplies to families who preregister at the Gardner CAC.






Diaper Pantry Update

Singing has such a unique way of bringing your heart, soul, mind, and strength together to focus entirely and completely on God. In an age of distraction, singing grabs the attention of all our senses and focuses us on God.

St. Paul's Music Academy

Open to all 2nd to 8th graders in Gardner and surrounding towns.

St. Paul's Music Academy is a program of music instruction and choir singing open to all children who are in the 2nd through 8th grades. Attendance at St. Paul's Episcopal Church is not required. This is a community children's music program. Membership is not restricted to members of St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

St. Paul's Music Academy uses a music education approach, teaching children how to read and write music and to sing in choir groupings. The goal is to provide children with an understanding of music which they can enjoy for a lifetime, and musical skills they can use to sing in any choir. Instruction is structured and tailored to each child's heart and voice.

Sessions will be held on Thursdays in the Choir Room from 4:30 to 6:00 pm.

There is NO COST for materials, and Semester One and Two of 2018 are FREE.

St. Paul's Music Academy uses the Royal School of Church Music in America curriculum, *Voice for Life*. Voice for Life teaches students to use their voices properly, gives them music reading skills, teaches understanding of choir music, and offers the opportunity to perform short programs of music. Singers study several levels of music, with a goal of graduating successfully into the next level. Awards are given for successful completion of levels. The program is ideal for children who would like to have the best musical training possible.


This year marks a new chapter in the musical life at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. This new program of music instruction for Elementary School students will begin on Thursday, February 1, 2018. The program will include 16 lessons divided into two Semesters of Study. All lessons will be on Thursdays from 4:30 to 6:00. Lessons will be held in the choir room. Parents are welcome to stay and learn with their children. There will be a Mid-Program Open House and a Concluding Performance at St. Paul's.




SUNDAY, APRIL 22, 2018




As Denis mentioned in his Warden's Wanderings, the Presiding Bishop,
