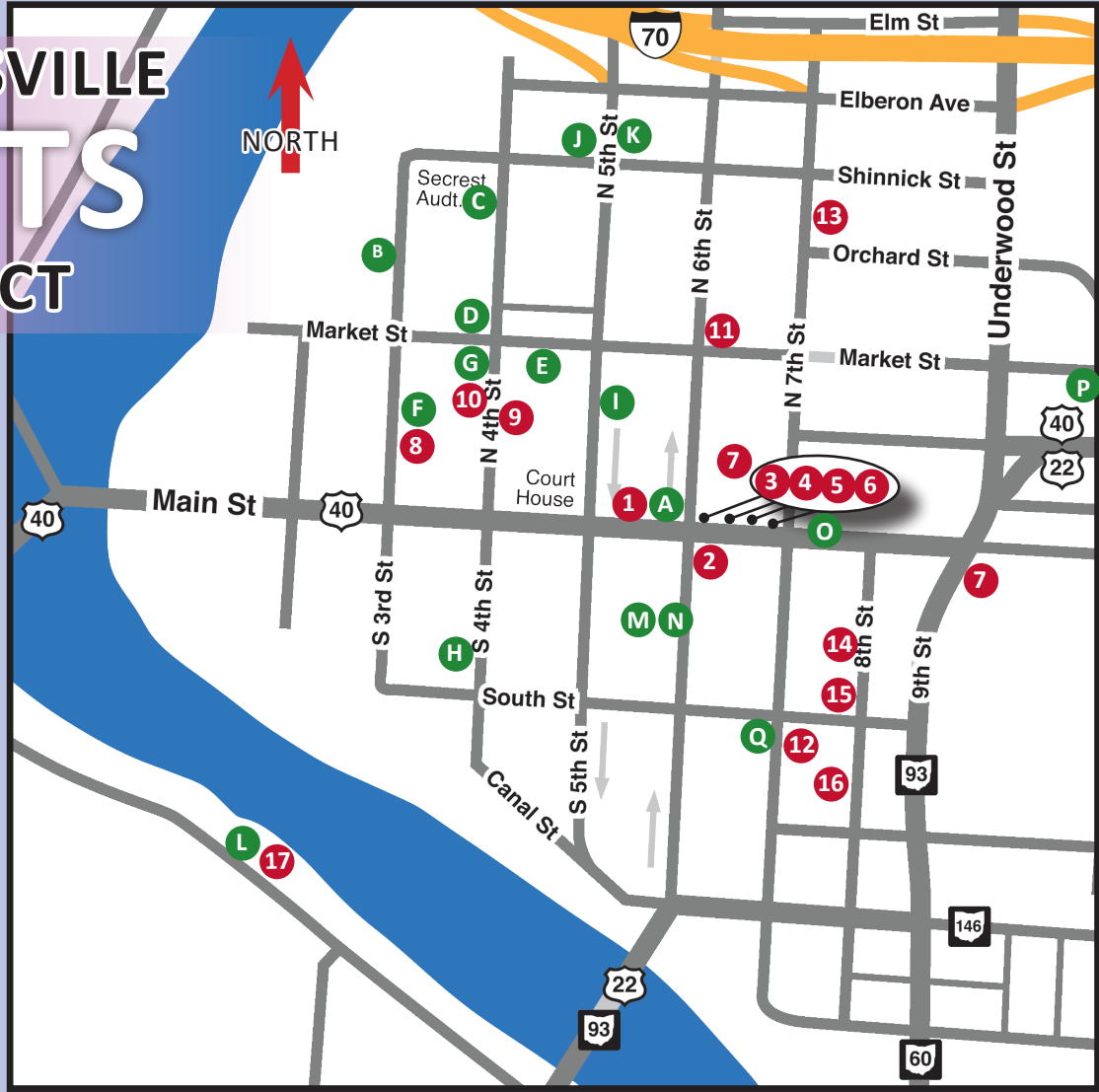

Artist of the Month



The Renner Theater:

Nestled in downtown Zanesville, The Renner, Home of Zane Trace Players is a charming little performing arts space filled with stories and more. The building's history is a celebration of people and tradition which continues today, only in different ways. The building began as a Jewish Synagogue. The beautifully crafted stained-glass windows cast a kaleidoscope of colors into the lobby creating an aura of magic when people enter. As time passed, the building became a Black Baptist Church where many congregated in the celebration of fellowship. In the mid 80's, Dorothy Renner was looking for a theatrical place to call home. She acquired the property on 148 N. 7th Street. The building continues to serve as a place where people come together in celebration. The Renner, named in honor of Dorothy and her theatrical legacy, is now operated by a board of directors whose passion is telling a story and sharing the craft. Auditions are open to all and no prepared pieces are necessary. Members of The Renner are often found sharing their knowledge at work parties: set building, set artistry, light design, soundscapes, prop history and costume design, to name a few. In exploring a production, directors immerse themselves and their cast members into the world of story exploring such things as show history, the nuance of living during that time, the significance of character and the world in which they live, the clothing, the accessories and importance of what they say and do and how it impacts other members of the story. At The Renner, a performance is so much more than "putting on a play" – it is an experience. A Renner passion is community. Whether it is continuing an environment where all participants feel at home and empowered or if it is a contribution to the aid of others, members of The Renner believe in helping. Rich Tolliver anchors the Annual Angel Tree Benefits where both community theaters in Zanesville, as well as volunteers, combine their skills to create, promote and produce a holiday story that benefits the Salvation Army. For over 30 years now, this endeavor has become one of Zanesville's longest traditions in giving- raising thousands of dollars for neighbors in need during the holidays. As the community is emerging from the realities of COVID-19, The Renner is gearing up for a new season of shows and theatrical adventures. I began taking Suzuki piano lessons at age 5, and I believe the ear training involved in the Suzuki method helped me to learn music more naturally. The ability to play by ear makes it easier to learn new songs. I eventually transitioned to traditional piano lessons, during which time I received a good grounding in music theory. In junior high school I began playing the trumpet, which became my primary instrument in college. I dabbled with bass guitar along the way. I attended Muskingum University from 2008-2012 and received my Bachelor of Arts in music. I have played with local bands like the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band, the Dick Simcox Big Band and the Dave Schubach Big Band. In college I started my own group called The Mighty Morphin' Jazz Arrangers, and we played at a First Friday Art Walk years ago. I moved to Santa Fe, New Mexico for a couple of years to study philosophy at St. John's College. While I was there, I performed Handel's Messiah and other choral works with the Santa Fe Symphony Chorus. I also won a prize at St. John's College for my music composition "The Hoopoe Song". After moving back to Zanesville, I performed Handel's Messiah with the Zanesville Civic Chorus at Carnegie Hall in New York City! This solo act is a new venture for me. I have spent the past year working on my piano skills so I can accompany myself. I am playing music from Billy Joel, Elton John, and the Beatles. I also have some songs from Argentina and Iceland! I am so excited to be the featured musician for August! This is a great way to make my debut as a solo artist!

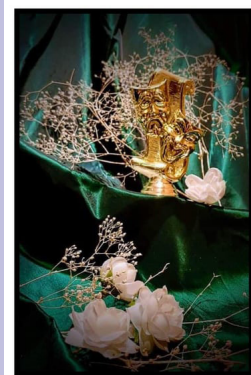

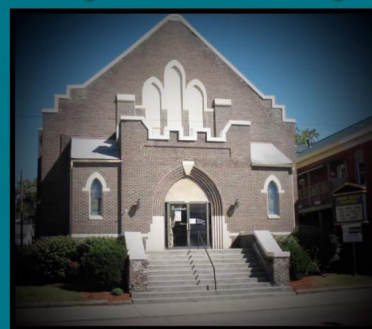

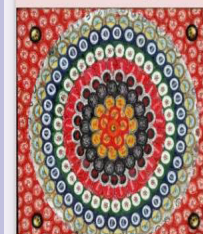
Real - Surreal: The Magic of Trompe l'oeil Paintings

"Real - Surreal: The Magic of Trompe l'oeil Paintings"

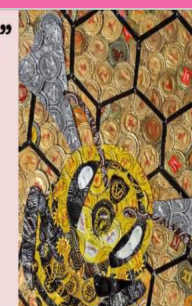
