Message from Rabbi Colt:

(February 2023)

Two months ago we gathered together for the community Chanukah party. A surprisingly, delightfully large crowd gathered outside in downtown Westfield to light the Chanukah menorah publicly. I was moved to see several families with children in the crowd; some of the children were decked out in Chanukah themed PJs and sweaters. It seemed important to their parents that they see Judaism proudly practiced in public, and that they be able to wear signs of their Jewish identity just like their Christian peers wear Christmas PJs.

This past week I was teaching my elementary school students' religious school class in the Boston area. This week we read the story "Hammerin' Hank: The Life of Hank Greenberg," a beautifully illustrated and concisely told story of the challenges and successes Hank Greenberg faced. We read about how strongly Jewish fans felt about seeing a publicly Jewish major league baseball player. Just like his Jewish fans at the time hotly

debated whether he should have played ball on the high holidays, my students easily jumped into that debate. They have experienced having to choose between beloved activities and Hebrew school or Jewish holiday observances. Although I don't think they found the idea of a Jewish major league player to be a big deal, I think they understood that he was a big deal for being one of the first ones. They resonated with his experiences of facing antisemitism and supporting Jackie Robinson in facing racism from fans and players. They understood intuitively that represented Jews publicly in a powerful way, and that was meaningful to them.

Both of these experiences, witnessing the Jewish children of Westfield and in my religious school class in Boston, reminded me powerfully that representation matters. It matters to children in the process of forming their Jewish identities, but it also matters to adults too! We continue to grow and develop in our Jewish identities over the course of our lives. Being publicly Jewish is not always easy, but I believe it is worth it. Connecting across lines of difference normalizes Jewish presence, and makes it easier for those who come after us. We come together at Jewish events (like the upcoming Passover Seder!) to energize our Jewish souls and support each other in continuing to live Jewish lives, both privately and publicly. I look forward to seeing you at our events on zoom and later in person this spring, as we continue to find meaningful ways to live our Jewish lives together.
