Stewardship Reflection

"...Behold, one is coming after me; I am not worthy to unfasten the sandals of his feet." - ACTS 13:25

Stewardship is a lifestyle, it's not a program or a process. It's how we are called to live our lives twentyfour hours a day, seven days a week! It challenges us to live "Godcentered" lives, not "self-centered" lives. Reflect on your daily activities, do you do them for the glory of God or for the glory of your own name?

Something New

John the Baptist said he was makina way for someone greater, and over the centuries Christians have tended to take him at his word, maybe a little too much so, seeing him as a stage left. To think of him this way, though, is to make him into exactly the opposite of what he stood for: a radically new way to relate to God. True, in a sense John dressed and acted like a prophet, but he rejected a key aspect of the tradition from which he came. He was not to be Zechariah Jr., the son who would carry on the family Temple priesthood business. Piety, birth, and the prestige of institutional religion weren't enough to get you saved, John was saying. Being a member of the people whom God led across the Jordan River didn't mean you needn't immerse yourself in it again. No, what you needed was

repentance—turning away from your old life and going out to meet God's judgment now.

"Christians are made, not born," said the early church figure Tertullian. To be a Christian is to be reborn, to beain again, to seek a new righteousness with God. Of this message, John the Baptist was a prophet. Joel Schorn


