Snow Removal and Parking

The Town of Preeceville would like to remind you to avoid shoveling or ploughing your snow on to the streets, back alleys and sidewalks. Piling snow on to these areas causes extra work for the snow removal crew which delays other streets from being cleared. Snow piles also become packed and freeze, which may cause damage to the snow removal equipment. Also, please be reminded that vehicles are not to be parked on the street for more than a 24-hour period and vehicles are not to be parked so that they are obstructing a sidewalk, as this also obstructs and reduces snow removal.
