#### **BACILE SCHOLARSHIP – APPLICATIONS**

Did you know, since inception through 2018, the Dr. Victor A. Bacile Scholarship Program has awarded 108 scholarships valued at more than \$207,000?

A great reason for being a member of the Italian Center/Ladies Auxiliary... Members, spouses and children are all eligible for the scholarship!

The Scholarship Fund Board of Directors will be awarding up to three (3) \$3,000 Scholarships in 2019, here is a link to the <u>Dr. Bacile Scholarship Application</u>.

To be eligible, a student must be registered full-time (12 credit hours or more) and must have completed their freshman year of study at an accredited college or university leading to an Associate or Baccalaureate degree and must have completed a minimum of 20 credit hours.

The applicant must be a member of the Italian Center/Ladies Auxiliary, or a spouse, son or daughter of a member. Children or spouses of deceased members in good standing are also eligible. Recipients from prior years are not eligible.

## Wine Making Class for Beginners

The Italian Center is dedicated to preserve and celebrate Italian traditions. Wine making is one of Italy's oldest traditions for centuries. Our Italian ancestors always had a well-stocked wine cellar and no meal was complete without some homemade wine. Italian Immigrants in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century brought their wine making skills to America. Many of our members recall our grandparents or parents making wine in early fall when the harvested grapes were available. You may still remember the smooth taste of their classic homemade deep red table wines.

Many of our members regret not learning wine making skills from our elders. Interestingly, I've heard some of our members mention they would like to make wine but they fear wine making was too time consuming; too technical or just too difficult. The good news is that homemade wine is now easier than ever to make and with a little guidance you can soon impress your family and friends with a bottle of homemade wine. Your homemade wine is full of love, fun, pride and memories, ingredients you won't find in a store-bought bottle of wine.

I've recruited a couple of wine making experts to show you how to make homemade wine. John Mazzetti, a well-known member and long-time wine maker will host our beginner's class. John and his crew of wine

makers produce huge quantities of homemade wines for years. If you haven't tasted some of John's wine, make sure you attend our class. I think we can get John to bring a few bottles for a small taste. I'm also asking all our Italian member wine makers to bring a few of their homemade wines to add to our tasting.

John will be joined by Jerry Pantano, owner of <u>Pantano's Wine Grapes & Home</u> <u>Brew</u> in New Paltz. Jerry is the go-to source for wine making equipment and



ingredients. Jerry will bring the equipment needed for beginner's wine making and together with John, will demonstrate making homemade wine.

Our beginner's class will focus on wine making with juice and kits. While pressing grapes to make grape juice will be discussed, making wine from pre-pressed grape juice or concentrated juice kits is much easier and makes great wine. Grapes are now grown in many countries, but are harvested once a year so your wine by crushing grapes is limited to a few weeks a year.

Fortunately, grapes are now pressed in their country of origin and the juice is shipped around the world and available in containers or concentrated kits all year. There is a large variety of red and white juices available so with a little instruction you can be making all kinds of wine whenever you like. Just think, very soon you'll be enjoying one of Italy's greatest traditions, a glass of homemade wine with your meals. It makes a great gift too.

The free class will be held on Wednesday, August 21 at 7 pm. We will demonstrate the equipment needed to make great homemade wine. We will show you how to mix the juice with yeast. The juice will then be taken away from the club to ferment. When our wine is ready to bottle, our class will return, bottle the wine and distribute it to class members to take home. Our wine making experts will gladly answer all your winemaking questions.

If you ever had an interest in making homemade wine, don't miss this opportunity. Don't forget to bring your family and friends so everyone can enjoy making wine together. You must sign up in advance, so don't hesitate, sign up now.

late 19th and early 20th centuries. For more information about this award winning film see this article.







