# 5th Sunday of Lent - Year B 20th - 21st March 2021

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

The days are coming when I will make a new covenant with Israel and I will forgive their iniquity. See, the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks - when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours. 'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.' By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.



# **Death is a Door to Life Eternal**

One focus during Lent is to reflect on our own death and to see our way through it. We all must die, as much as we don't like the fact. We try to hide it, dodge it, and deny it. Yet we can't in fact escape it. Jesus came into the world, not so much to do away with death, but to teach us how to die by his example and then to assure us that death does not say the last word about life. When we walk into the valley of death we do not walk alone. Jesus is with us because He has been there before and knows what it is like. Moreover, he promises us that just as he rose from the dead, so will we. We will all be young again. We will all laugh again.

Once upon a time there was a young grandmother who totally adored her oldest grandson like most grandmothers do. He was a good young man too. Handsome, friendly, courteous, more mature than you could reasonably expect any teenager to be. He was also an excellent athlete at his school. Then, just a week before graduation, another teen (quite drunk) plowed into the car in which the young man was returning from a baseball game. He died three hours later in the hospital. Everyone in

the family was devastated, as you can well imagine. The grandmother was furious. "Why do such terrible things happen?" she demanded. "Why did it have to happen to my grandson? What kind of God would permit this to happen to me? He must be a cruel and vicious God. Why should I believe in him? I don't believe in him. My grandson was so voung: he had the rest of his life ahead of him. It's all right for old people to die, but not for someone who had a right to a long



and happy life. I don't believe in heaven. I don't believe in anything."

She carried on like this for months, making the tragedy even harder for her family. She stopped going to Church and refused to talk to the priest who dropped by her house to talk to her. "I just hate God," she insisted. Then one night, maybe she was dreaming, maybe she was half away, her grandson, in his baseball uniform, came to visit it her. "Cool it, Grams." he told her. "I'm happy. Life is much better where I am. You're not acting like my Grams any more. We all have to die sometime, young or old, but here we're all young and we're all laughing."

The grandmother began to let go of her grief and rage. She came back to her senses. She began to pray and go to the church again, as she usually did. She inspired many other people to put their trust in God and accept death as a part of our life on earth. DEATH IS A DOOR TO ETERNAL LIFE.

# A special year to bear witness to Family Love: 'Amoris Laetitia Family'

On 19th March 2021, the fifth anniversary of the Apostolic Exhortation *Amoris laetitia*, on the joy and beauty of familial love, Pope Francis will inaugurate the Year "Amoris Laetitia Family," which will conclude on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2022 at the World Meeting of Families in Rome.

In announcing the year, the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life said the pandemic experience has highlighted the central role of the family as the domestic Church, and illustrated the importance of community ties between families.

Through the spiritual, pastoral, and cultural initiatives planned in the Year "Amoris Laetitia Family," Pope Francis intends to address all ecclesial communities throughout the world, exhorting each person to be a witness of family love, the statement from the Dicastery said.

The Year "Amoris Laetitia Family" is intended to spread the message of Amoris laetitia, by encouraging the content of the exhortation to be shared more widely, to help people experience the Gospel of the family as a joy that fills hearts and lives' (Amoris laetitia, §200).

A family that discovers and experiences both the joy of having a gift, and of being a gift for the Church and society, "can become a light in the darkness of the world" (AL, §66).

During this year's Patrick Oration, Archbishop Peter A Comensoli spoke on the importance of the family as the domestic church.

Over these last twelve months we have suffered through the experience of our place of worship being locked to the visitor, and the person in need,' said Archbishop Comensoli. 'And yet, in our homes we rediscovered the living bread of God's love for each person, and the call to serve one another.'
