

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Faith,

On Oct. 9, 2020, the Franciscan Friars of St. John the Baptist Province informed the Diocese of Jefferson City of two priests of their order who are now deceased -- Father Severin Lamping, OFM, and Father Stephen Lamping, OFM – were identified as having substantiated child sex abuse allegations against them. The diocese was also informed that the substantiated allegations did not relate to the time when they ministered in the Diocese of Jefferson City.

Father Severin Lamping was ordained in the order of Franciscan Friars (OFM) on March 16, 1929. His assignments in the Diocese of Jefferson City were:

Immaculate Conception, Macon
St. Clement, Bowling Green
Resurrection, Wellsville
June 20, 1957 to March 1958
March 3, 1958 to July 1970
July 16, 1970 to July 1, 1973

After he retired in July 1973, he moved to Bowling Green and provided support at St. Clement and neighboring parishes. He died April 13, 1986.

Father Stephen Lamping was ordained in the order of Franciscan Friars (OFM) on March 16, 1929. His assignments in the Diocese of Jefferson City were:

Sacred Heart, Bevier June 20, 1957 – August 14, 1957 Resurrection, Wellsville August 14, 1957 – July 1, 1973 St. Patrick, Jonesburg August 14, 1957 – July 1, 1973

After he retired in July 1973, he moved to Bowling Green and provided support at St. Clement and neighboring parishes. He died Dec. 7, 1995.
